The Show’s week long festivities offer treats, teaching, fun and camaraderie for equestrians young and old.

Over the past few years, the Junior Committee instituted some new technology and events. We began hosting our Silent Auction virtually, helping us raise enough money to donate \$5,000 to the Fauquier SPCA, which made our total of giving over the years nearly \$85,000! We are very excited to be bringing the Silent Auction to everyone virtually again. Details for registration and bidding will be posted closer to the Show. And, as always, we welcome the donation of special items for the auction. Additionally, we instituted arts and crafts for exhibitors and their friends and families, which culminated with an exciting pool noodle pony race with the “ponies” crafted by the competitors. We also organize horsemanship clinics and offer daily hospitality to exhibitors, all of which are available for sponsorship.

Working on the Pony Show Committee gives us all an understanding of the challenges and rewards of running a successful event. It makes us better exhibitors, and gives us a sense of community by benefiting another organization. We look forward to welcoming everyone to the fun railside at the end of June!

SMALL FRY

In our determination to present the unusual and the significant in horse shows, rather than the flowery or the merely factual, we present this month the extraordinary story of the Warrenton Pony Show — started 18 years ago by children and run by them so successfully that today they offer a show with 37 classes and 400 entries!

This engrossing story, of interest not only to children everywhere but to their vexed parents as well, was written for us by the talented PEGGY KEITH HAMILTON, herself the daughter of a well-known horse family.

BUT I don't want to join any old dancing class."

The little girl's mother looked at her in despair. "Then what do you want?"

"I want to ride; I want a riding class," eagerly. And that was the germ of the Warrenton Pony Show, now in its eighteenth year and a feature of the Virginia horse program.

The child was Winifred Maddux (daughter of that well-known sportsman, the late J. K. Maddux, and the present Mrs. Raymond Belmont, an equal devotee of the *genus equinus*), so the youngster came by her heritage naturally.

A club was formed, composed of a small group of children who took rides on stated days under the guidance of Frank, one of the best grooms who ever schooled a horse. But when winter passed to summer this rambling along by-roads became too tame and the children decided to have a drag.

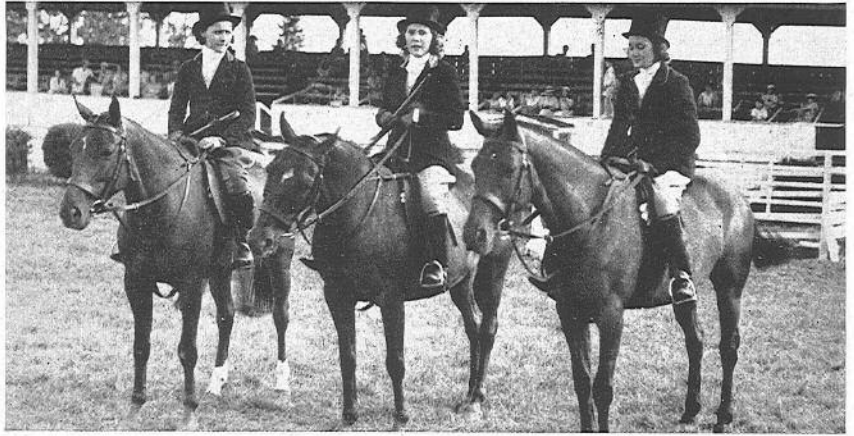
Down came panels — one or two in each fence — all over the Maddux farm, where presently about twelve children arrived on their ponies for the exciting experience of their first "hunt."

This proved so successful that before the tea and sandwiches had been consumed, the Warrenton Junior Hunt had been formed, the first of its kind in America, with little Winifred as president.

DRAGS continued to be held at irregular intervals all summer; the host or hostess of the day acting as Master, or *Leader*, to be more exact, since the Junior Hunt was conspicuously lacking in hounds. This, however, was the least of their worries, as the members often hacked their Shetland ponies five or six miles to the meet, rode the drag, and then took part in gymkhana sports, which usually followed on big days; finally finishing off with refreshments, which were no small part of the attraction. After all this they rode their ponies home; many of them to rub-out and feed their ponies themselves.

Toward the end of summer, Mrs. Maddux, at the earnest solicitation of the youthful members obtained the loan of the Warrenton Horse Show grounds, where the first Warrenton Pony Show was held.

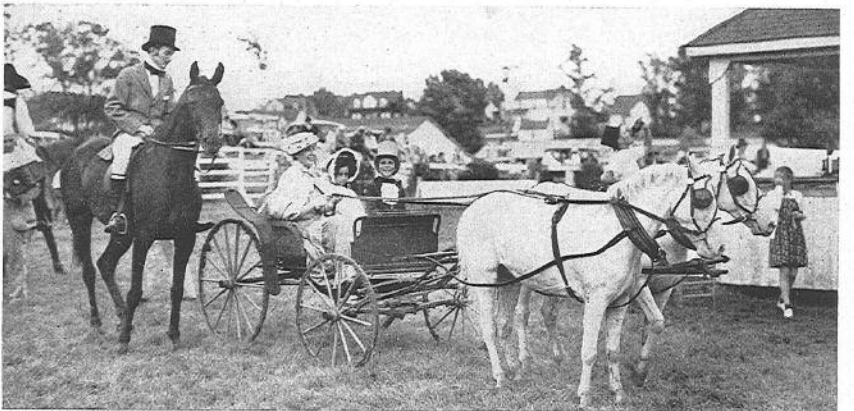
It was a crude affair, but to the children immensely important; they took themselves very seriously. There were seven classes, the prizes being donated by interested friends and ribbons made by the members. There were saddle and jumping classes — with small roughly constructed hurdles for the latter — and finally a pony race (four times around the ring) to end the day in a big way.

USEF thanks you for participating in this competition and your support of USEF's continuous efforts to provide the safest environment possible for our athletes and other participants. Strategies for safeguarding athletes continue to evolve, and we are fully committed to keeping pace with best practices.

The purpose of this letter is to remind you that you are bound by the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies, also known as the MAAPP. This includes the SafeSport Training requirement for adult members and participants who have regular contact with minor athletes. Additionally, please be reminded about reporting obligations. Any concerns that are non-sexual in nature, please use the USEF SafeSport Incident Reporting Form available on the USEF website. Concerns or suspicions regarding sexual misconduct must be reported to <https://safesport.i-sight.com/portal> and the authorities if a minor is involved. All of this information can be found in the USEF SafeSport Policy.

2024 RULES AND REGULATIONS

To simplify your arrival at the show, please send the following items with your entries: **USEF and USHJA Membership Cards • Amateur Certification • Measurement Cards (Ponies & Junior Hunters) • Negative Coggins Certificate (within 12 months) • EHV Vaccination letter stating horse has been vaccinated within 6 months • Home address and USEF/USHJA/VHSA/MHSA membership numbers for all trainers, riders & owners in USEF/VHSA Medals and Equitation.** (Numbers will not be issued until all of the required information has been presented.)

1. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF, MHSA, and VHSA Rule Books will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith and in accordance with Zone 3 specifications. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.
2. Entries close June 20, 2024. No Telephone Entries. Online entries accepted at www.horseshowsonline.com. Stall Fees must accompany entry blank. No stalls will be assigned until stall fees are paid. There is a limited number of permanent stalls that will be assigned on a first come basis. Temporary stalls with doors will be used.
3. In case of horses or ponies being entered and not exhibited, the entry fees and/or stabling fees will be forfeited except if a horse or pony is injured or becomes ill prior to being shown in any class. Applications for refunds must be submitted in writing and accompanied by a Veterinarian's certificate. There will be no refunds for stalls. There will be a \$35.00 charge for any returned checks. Post entries will incur a \$30 late fee.
4. The Committee reserves the right to postpone, combine or cancel any class or classes if, in its judgement, the entries are inadequate, for reasons of inclement weather or dangerous conditions or for any other reason it deems necessary.
5. All ponies must be ridden by Juniors, except in Connemara Division.
6. All Exhibitors must wear protective headgear at all times while mounted on the Show Grounds.
7. Total amount of rated hunter prize money offered is \$10,795.
8. Neither Warrenton Pony Show, Inc. or its employees or owner will be responsible for any accident which may occur to any rider, groom, attendant, animal or equipment at the Show.
9. Dogs must be on leashes while on Show Grounds.
10. Should any questions or disputes arise that are not provided for in the foregoing Rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee whose decision shall be final.
11. Classes may be held in an area other than designated.
12. All horses must have a negative Coggin's Test made within one year. As per USEF GR 845, horses entering the show grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Health Certificates (within 30 days) for all out of state horses. These documents must be available for inspection by a representative of the State Veterinarian upon request. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.
13. Jumps to consist of Brush, Aiken, Panel, White Gate, Picket, Roll Top, Natural Gate, and Stone and Brick Wall.
14. The main ring is 180'x230'; both the main and schooling rings have all-weather footing. Lunging pads available.
15. **Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above**

and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. **Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.** The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. **All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.**

16. All horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

REMINDER

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Warrenton Pony Show (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908 4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status.

BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time, as well as all terms and provisions of this Prize List. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.:

Under VA Code Ann. Sec 3.2-6200-6203, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

Points to be scored 10-6-4-2-1-.5 multiplied by the number of entries in the class regardless of classification of the show. Finalists will be requested to ride over a course of not less than 8 jumps; 2'3" for small ponies, 2'6" for medium ponies and large ponies jump 2'9" - 3'. All VHSA/EMO Medal Class courses must have at least two of the following inside the course: a roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, or a long ride to a single jump. Jumping faults of mount not to count. Fall of pony or rider or two disobediences by a pony does eliminate the finalist. A minimum of twelve riders, if available, will be asked to return to show at a walk, trot and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion. Martingales are prohibited on the flat. Jumping phase to count 75 percent. Flat phase to count 25 percent and following the flat phase, no less than four riders will return for additional testing from tests 1-18.

An exhibitor can qualify for the Pony Medal Finals up to and including the Warrenton Pony Show.

VHSA / EMO Pony Medal Equitation on the Flat Finals

To qualify for the VHSA/EMO Pony Medal Equitation On The Flat Finals, the top twenty point accrualers based on a 10-6-4-2-1-.5 multiplied by the number of entries in the class point system will be chosen. However, two blue ribbons will be an automatic qualification. Points to be scored 10-6-4-2-1-.5 multiplied by the number of entries in the class regardless of classification of the show. All riders must show all working gaits (walk, trot, and canter) in both directions as well as lengthening of stride at all working gaits in each direction. The sitting trot should be a working sitting trot. Riders may be asked to drop stirrups. The judge may request additional tests on the flat as a group or individually. Regulation snaffles, pelhams, and full bridles, all with cavesson nosebands are permitted. A judge at their discretion may penalize unconventional bits or nosebands. Martingales are prohibited.

VHSA / EMO Children's Pony Medal Equitation Finals

To qualify for the VHSA/EMO Children's Pony Medal Equitation Finals, the top twenty point accrualers based on a 10-6-4-2-1-.5 multiplied by the number of entries in the class point system will be chosen. However, two blue ribbons will be an automatic qualification. Points to be scored 10-6-4-2-1-.5 multiplied by the number of entries in the class regardless of classification of the show. Finalists will be requested to ride over a course of not less than 8 jumps; small and medium ponies to jump 2', large ponies to jump 2'6". All VHSA Medal Class courses must have at least two of the following inside the course: a roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, or a long ride to a single jump. Jumping faults of mount not to count. Fall of pony or rider or two disobediences by a pony does eliminate the finalist. A minimum of twelve rider, if available, will be asked to return to show at a walk, trot and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion. Martingales are prohibited on the flat. Jumping phase to count 75 percent. Flat phase to count 25 percent and following the flat phase, no less than four riders will return for additional testing from tests 1-18.
