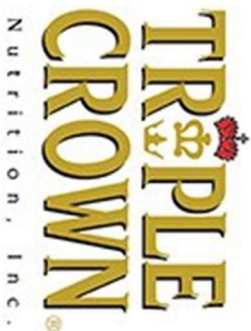

FEES

- \$20 per class
- \$25 for medal classes
- \$25 for classic classes
- \$40 per stall/per day
- \$25 grounds fee without a stall
- \$25 non-showing horse fee
- \$15 office fee

ENTRIES

- The Horse Show Office will be located in East Complex and will be open Friday before the show from 3:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Show Office will be open one hour before the start of the show and will remain open until the close of the show.
- If possible, exhibitors are asked to leave an open check rather than cash.
- All exhibitors must show at the Show Office a copy of current negative coggins taken within one year for each horse admitted onto the show grounds.
- Equine Activity Release/Waiver on the Entry Form must be signed by all exhibitors or by a parent/guardian of minor exhibitors.
- Helmets must be worn when mounted.
- Six ribbons will be awarded in each class. Champion and Reserve ribbons awarded in all divisions.
- Stalls are available from Friday afternoon August 19th. Stall fees are \$40 per day/night. Stall reservation must be called into Emily Guyer (540)-448-3921, or Diane Hinch at (540) 448-0019 before 12:00 pm by Wednesday August 17th.
- Tack stall splits are only available if done on the entry blank in advance. Please note that the total may exceed 100%.
- Pre-entries are recommended and should be sent to Diane Hinch, 44 Windy Grove Lane, Fishersville, VA 22939 or online at HorseShowsOnline.com.

GROUNDS

- Schooling will be permitted on Friday August 19th, 2022 after 2:00 p.m.
- Show management reserves the right to have a controlled schooling break.
- Refreshments will be available on the show grounds.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS (CON'T)

SWVHJA PRE-BEGINNER EQUITATION - Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences less than 2' in height. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights of 2' or above. This division will not count against rider's one-year eligibility for the Beginner Equitation division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Division may be combined with the Beginner Equitation division at Management's discretion if entries warrant. Fence height 18". No oxers permitted.

BEGINNER EQUITATION - Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences 2' in height. No oxers permitted. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights exceeding 2'. This division will not count against rider's 2 year eligibility for the Intermediate Hunter division. Judged on rider's position and control. Division may be split between juniors, and adults at the discretion of show management.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 14 & Under - Open to riders who have not reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries required to fill this class. Open to non-SWVHJA members. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 15-17 and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

HOPEFUL HUNTER - Open to all horses and ponies. Judged on performance, manners and way of going. Fences 2'3".

INTERMEDIATE HUNTER - Open to riders in their 1st or 2nd year of showing, on horses or ponies, excluding Beginner Equitation division. Fences 2'3". Riders who show at 2'6" or above in their first year forfeit a 2nd Intermediate year. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Rider may not jump higher than 2'6" at the same show.

SWVHJA PONY MEDAL - Open to current junior members of SWVHJA mounted on ponies. Shown over a minimum of 6 jumps at the appropriate heights. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. The same pony must be used for both phases. Four entries required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If no Pony Medal is offered, a rider may compete on a pony in the Hunter Seat Medal. Riders cannot compete in both the Pony and the Hunter Seat Medals in one show, nor can they participate in both aforementioned finals in one year. SWVHJA Pony Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners, with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Pony Medal Finals.

SMALL/MEDIUM PONY HUNTER - Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult in any recognized division at the same horse show. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Small ponies (not to exceed 12.2h) to jump 2', medium ponies (over 12.2h - not to exceed 13.2h) to jump 2'3". Divisions must be offered split, but if there are not three ponies in either the Small/Medium or Large Pony divisions, the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

LARGE PONY HUNTER - Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult in any recognized division at the same horse show. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Large ponies (over 13.2h - not to exceed 14.2h) to jump 2'6". Divisions must be offered split, but if there are not three ponies in either the Small/Medium or Large Pony divisions, the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

PUDDLE JUMPER (.70M) - Open to ALL horses and ponies

NOVICE JUMPER (.75M) - Open to horses and ponies in their 1st or 2nd year of showing in jumper classes at .75m or higher as of December 1st of the current show year.

NOVICE CHILD/ADULT JUMPER (.75m) - Open to horses and ponies in their 1st or 2nd year of showing in jumper classes at .75m or higher as of December 1st of current show year. Riders in this division may only cross enter into Novice Jumper if eligible.

SCHOOLING/LEVEL 2 JUMPER (.95m) - USEF Tables I-IV may be used.

Child/Adult Jumper (1.00m) USEF Tables I-IV may be used.

OAK RIDGE MEDAL CLASS - Open to junior and amateur riders. Over fence phase will consist of a USEF type equitation, A-O/Jr. jumper course of at least ten fences at a height of 3'-3'3" with spreads to 4'. Flat phase to count 50% and must run first. No martingales in the flat phase. Top ten riders will be called back for the over fences phase. Jump order is determined by the judge. Judge may require additional tests from USEF tests 1-19. Complete specifications are available in the show office. Minimum of 4 to fill.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

OPEN/VHSA WORKING HUNTER - Open to all horses and ponies ridden by an adult. Ponies shown may not be shown in pony hunter divisions. Judged on performance, manners and way of going. Fences to be 2'6".

GREEN HUNTER - Open to horses in their first or second year of showing over fences at 2'6" or higher. To be eligible horses may have only shown over fences in 3 shows or less at 2'3" or lower the previous year. Fences to be 2'6" and 3'. Both heights offered and judged together.

LOW HUNTER - Open to horses and ponies. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'.

SWVHJA ADULT MEDAL - Same specs as SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class, except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same show. If fewer than four entries, class can be combined with the Hunter Seat Medal. SWVHJA Adult Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners, with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Adult Medal Finals.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER - Open to adult amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. Fences 3'. Management may combine with the Children's Hunter division if less than 3 entries.

ADULT EQUITATION ON THE FLAT - Open to amateurs 18 years of age and older. Shown at walk, trot, and canter both directions and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Competitors need not be members of SWVHJA. If insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Jr. Equitation on the Flat. Riders must stay within age group if split by age.

SWVHJA HUNTER SEAT MEDAL - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. Shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3' that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. Same horse must be used for both phases. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If less than four entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners, with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Hunter Seat Medal Finals.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER - Open to juniors mounted on horses. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'. Management may combine this division with the Adult Amateur Hunter division if less than 3 entries.

WORKING HUNTER - Open to horses. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'3" or 3'6".

SWEET BRIAR MEDAL - Open to junior and amateur riders on horses or ponies and who have not qualified for a SWVHJA Medal class or the Oak Ridge Medal during the current show year. Class to consist of two phases judged 50% each. The first phase will be the over fences phase of not less than 8 fences at 2'6" and may not contain a combination. The course must contain two changes of direction after the first fence. The second phase shall be ridden on the flat at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Judges may choose from USEF 1 - 10. Martingales will be permitted in the flat phase. The same horse must be used for both phases of the class.

HOLLINS MEDAL

SPECIAL ADULT HUNTER - Open to Adult Amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Fences to be 2'6" or 2'9". Both heights must be offered and judged together. Related distances between two jumps should be no less than 60' (4 strides). Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Horse/rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2'9" at the same horse show. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the pony hunter division at the same horse show. The Special Adult Hunter division and the Special Children's Hunter division may be combined if there are fewer than 3 in either section.

SPECIAL CHILDREN'S HUNTER - Same specs as the Special Adult Hunter, except open to junior riders.

ADULT HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE - Open to horses ridden by an adult.

JUNIOR HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE - Open to horses ridden by a junior.

HUNTER PLEASURE PONY - Open to juniors mounted on ponies.

PRE-SHORT STIRRUP - Open to riders 10 years of age and under. Riders may be asked to walk, trot and perform simple tests. Riders may not cross enter in any cantering classes.

LEAD LINE - Open to riders 6 years of age and under. Riders may not cross enter in any other class at the horse show.

PLEASURE HUNTER - Open to all horses and ponies. Judged on performance, manners and way of going. Fences 18" to 2'. No oxers.

VIRGINIA HORSE CENTER RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Upon arrival at the Virginia Horse Center, all trailers MUST check in at the Stable Office.
2. A negative Coggins must be provided for every horse brought onto the grounds and turned into the Stable Office (state law). Horses coming from out of state are required have a health certificate (federal law).
3. NO SMOKING IN COLISEUM OR BARN. THIS IS THE LAW.
4. VEHICLES: Drive carefully. Obey all traffic signs. Speed limits are strictly enforced. Every vehicle must have a valid driver's license and proof of insurance. The use of vehicles in the camping areas is restricted to regular roadways for entering and exiting only. Vehicles are permitted only if operated in a safe manner (VA state law), but may not be used in the Coliseum or in the interior of any of the barns. Four wheelers and ATV's are not permitted on the VHC grounds. Non-powered scooters, bicycles, skateboards, in-line skates, heelers (skates in shoes) are not permitted in the Coliseum or the interior of any of the barns. The VHC reserves the right to prohibit the operation of any vehicle.
5. ELECTRICAL CONDUIT IN BARN: ABSOLUTELY NOTHING SHOULD BE HUNG FROM THE ELECTRICAL CONDUIT IN THE BARN. ELECTROCUTION AND DEATH CAN OCCUR AS THIS CONDUIT CONTAINS HIGH VOLTAGE LINES. ANYONE CONNECTION OR HANGING ANYTHING FROM THIS CONDUIT WILL BE FINED \$1,000.00.
6. MANURE PITS: NO TRASH OR SHARPS IN THE MANURE PITS. SHARPS MUST BE PLACED IN THE RED CONTAINERS IN THE BARN. SHOW WITH SHARPS IN THE MANURE PITS WILL BE FINED \$1,000.00. HAS/MAT WILL FINE THE VHC FOR SHARPS IN THE PITS.
7. DOGS/PETS: All dogs/pets must have current inoculation for rabies as prescribed by state of residency. No loose dogs/pets that are not crated must be on a hand-held or tied leash. Loose dog/pets will incur a \$100.00 fine. You must clean up after you dog/pet.
8. Absolutely no dogs/pets allowed in the Coliseum unless they are crated or are service dogs. Absolutely no dogs/pets in the Mezzanine under any circumstances, except service dogs.
9. All stalls must have at least one bale of shavings or straw. Sawdust is prohibited. Shavings may be purchased at the Stable Office.
10. No lunging in Wiley, Northern, B Ring, the Coliseum and the East Complex.
11. No overnight horses may be stabled in trailers or tied out.
12. Horses are absolutely not allowed to be ponied behind any moving vehicles.
13. Any loss, theft, accident or disturbance should be reported to the Virginia Horse Center Security Lost and Found, located in the Security Office.
14. No firearms or fireworks are permitted.
15. The Virginia Horse Center shall be held harmless against all claims, costs, losses or liability of every nature and kind asserted against or incurred by camper arising or resulting in any respect from camper's occupancy and use of premises, and/or visitor's use of premises.

The Virginia Horse Center, Show managers, SWVHJA officials, employees, and volunteers will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, rider, trainer, spectator, groom, or animal at this show.
