## **Hunter Division Specifications**

\*All Riders ages and Horse/Pony eligibility as of 12/1/2023.



<u>Leadline</u> - Open to riders 7 and under. Riders may not cross enter into any class where they would be asked to trot, including unjudged. To be judged 50% equitation and 50% suitability of mount.

<u>Pre-Short Stirrup Equitation</u> - Open to riders 10 years and under. Judged on equitation. Riders may not cross enter into any classes in which they would be asked to canter or jump.

<u>Short Stirrup Equitation</u> - Open to riders 12 years and under. Judged on equitation. Riders may not cross enter into classes where they would jump over 18". Courses may be trotted.

<u>Short Stirrup Hunter</u> - Open to riders 12 years and under. Riders may not cross enter into any VHSA division except Pleasure and Eq on the Flat. No rider may ride more than 2 mounts. Fences 18". Courses may be trotted. VHSA Only.

<u>Long Stirrup Equitation</u> - Open to riders 13 years and older. Judged on equitation. Riders may not cross enter into classes where they would jump over 18". Courses may be trotted.

Student Equitation - Open to riders in their first or second year of showing over fences at 2' or higher. Judged on equitation. Courses may be trotted

Pleasure Pony - Open to ponies ridden by Juniors. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and way of going.

Pleasure Horse - Open to any horse. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and way of going. To be split Adult and Junior.

Equitation on the Flat - Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs to show at a walk, trot, canter. Judges may do additional tests. To be split into Juniors 14 and under, Juniors 15-17, and Adult Amateurs if entries warrant.

<u>BHSA Pony Equitation</u> - Open to Junior riders mounted on ponies. Fence heights: 2' for small ponies, 2'3" for medium ponies and 2'6" for large ponies. The judge may select at least ¼ of the class to show at the walk, trot, and canter, and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion.

<u>Green Pony Hunter</u> - Open to ponies in their first year of showing over fences at regulation height. To be ridden by Juniors. Fence heights: 2' for small ponies, 2'3" medium ponies and 2'6" for large ponies.

<u>Maiden Hunter</u> - Open to horses and ponies in their first year of showing over fences at 2'or higher. No restriction on riders. Fence height 2'. Courses may be trotted.

Green Hunter - Open to horses in their first or second year of showing over fences at 2'6" or higher. Fence height 2'6".

<u>Pony Hunter</u> - Open to ponies ridden by Juniors. The division will be split into small/medium and large ponies if entries warrant. Fence heights: 2' for small ponies, 2'3" medium ponies and 2'6" for large ponies.

**Low Hunter** - Open to horses and ponies. No restrictions on riders. Fence height 2'3".

<u>Limit Rider Hunter</u> - Open to horses and ponies ridden by juniors and adult amateurs who are not entered in any classes jumping 2'6" or higher. These riders are not eligible for AA Equitation, Pony Equitation, or Jr./Children's Equitation. Horses and ponies may cross enter into other divisions. Courses to be a minimum of 6 fences set at 2' or 2'3".

Schooling Hunter - Open to horses and ponies. No restrictions on riders. Adults may ride ponies not entered in a Pony Division. Fence height 2'6".

<u>TIP Thoroughbred Hunter</u> - Open to registered TB's and horses eligible to be registered. Fence height 2'6".

Working Hunter - Open to all horses and ponies not entered in a Pony Division. Fence height 3'.

BHSA Children/Adult Amateur Equitation - Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs. Fence height 2'6" or 3'. The judge may select at least ¼ of the class to show at the walk, trot, and canter, and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion.

Adult Amateur Hunter - Open to horses and ponies not showing in a pony division ridden by Adult Amateurs. Fence height 2'6" and 3'.

<u>Children's Hunter</u> - Open to horses ridden by Juniors. Fence height 2'6" and 3'.

<u>VHSA Children's/Adult Amateur Medal</u> – Open only to Regular members of the VHSA. O/F Riders to compete over a regulation equitation course at 3'. In each class at least the top four riders must have additional tests. See VHSA Rule 14. For Flat medals must show at all working gaits with additional requirements and tests. See VHSA Rule 14 and Sect 7-10 of Rule 28.

♦ All hunter classes judged on performance, including way of going, jumping style, and soundness. Manners and suitability emphasized in Pony, Children's and Adult Amateur division. All Equitation classes judged on hands, seat, guidance and control.

## **Jumper Division Specifications**

\*All Riders ages and Horse/Pony eligibility as of 12/1/2023.



<u>Puddle Jumper</u>: Open to horses and ponies. Horses, ponies and riders in this Division may only cross enter into any class not exceeding 3' if otherwise eligible. Fences shall not be lower than 2' and not higher than 2'3", with spreads of not less than 2' and not greater than 2'3".

**Novice Jumper:** Open to horses and ponies in their first or second year of showing in Jumper classes at 2'6" or higher as of December 1<sup>st</sup> of the current show year. Horses and ponies in this division may only cross enter into Novice Children's/Adult Amateur Jumper if the rider is eligible, TB Jumper and Low Jumper and any other class not exceeding 3'. Fences shall be no lower than 2'3" and no higher than 2'6", with spreads of no less than 2'3" and no greater than 2'6".

Novice Children's/ Adult Amateur Jumper: Open horses and ponies ridden by Children and Adult Amateurs in their first or second year of showing in Jumper classes at 2'6" or higher as of December 1st of the current show year. Riders in this division may only cross-enter into Novice Jumper, if mount is eligible, TB Jumper and Low Jumper, and any other class not exceeding 3'. Fences shall be no lower than 2'3" and no higher than 2'6", with spreads no less than 2'3" and no greater than 2'6".

**Open Jumper:** Open to horses and ponies. No restrictions on riders. Jumps 2'6".

Low Jumper: Open to horses and ponies. No restrictions on riders. Fences shall be no lower than 2'9" and no higher than 3', with spreads no less than 2'9" and no greater than the height of the fence.

<u>TIP Thoroughbred Jumper</u>: Open registered TB's and horses eligible to be registered. No restrictions on riders. Fences shall be no lower than 2'9" and no higher than 3', with spreads no less than 2'9" and no greater than the height of the fence.

<u>Children's/Adult Amateur Jumper:</u> Open to horses and ponies ridden by Children and Adult Amateurs. Fences shall be no lower than 2'9" and no higher than 3', with spreads no less than 2'9" and no greater than the height of the fence.

<u>Schooling Jumper:</u> Open to horses and ponies. No restrictions on riders. Fences shall be no lower than 3' and no higher than 3'6", with spreads no less than 3' and no greater than the height of the fence.

<u>Modified Jumper:</u> Open to horses and ponies. No restrictions on riders. Fences shall be no lower than 3'6" and no higher than 4', with spreads no less than 3'6" (except in combinations where they must be at least 3'), and no greater than the height of the fence.

<u>Jr./Adult Amateur Jumper Equitation</u>: See BHSA Rules for class specifications. Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs. To be shown over a course of at least 10 fences with at least one combination, four oxers, and a minimum of two additional jumper style tests which may include a Liverpool, narrow fence, rollback turn, fence at the end of the ring, option fence. To be offered at two or three heights, 2'6", 2'9" and 3', with spreads not to exceed height, with one set of awards. Judge may ask some or all riders to return on the flat, the number of riders to return at the judge's discretion. Flat work may include shortening and lengthening of stride at all gaits and work without irons, and such other tests as the judge deems appropriate. Riders requested/required to wear coats and boots. Paddock boots with jodhpurs or matching half chaps allowed. To be judged on hands, seat, guidance, control and optimum time. Numerical scoring. Courses must be measured, and the jumps numbered and the Time Allowed and Optimum Times posted. Should a rider exceed the Time Allowed and gain Time Faults, those faults will reduce the numerical score.

### **Rules & Information**

#### General

- All exhibitors must wear ASTM/SEI protective helmets with harness fastened at all times when mounted on the showgrounds.
- Rose Mount Farm, per USEF GR 845, has asked that horses entering the showgrounds be accompanied by documentation of Equine
  Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior. Horses not in compliance with
  this request may be asked to leave the competition grounds upon request by Rose Mount Farm.
- Hunter Attire: Proper attire and equipment required. Jackets may be excused at the Judge's discretion.
- Jumper Attire: Boots and breeches/jodhpurs required with either polo shirts, riding shirts or jackets.
- All leather half chaps and matching proper boots allowed in both Hunter and Jumper classes.
- The Judge's decision is always final.
- No Ring will be held for any reason.
- A \$25 Vendor Fee will be applicable to all Vendors who are not Show Sponsors.

#### Schooling

- Schooling available in all Rings on Friday 3:00 6:00pm for \$20 per horse/pony for those not taking stalls.
- Schooling available in all Rings from 6:30-7:45am on Saturday.

#### Stabling

- Stalls available Friday after Noon for \$55 each (includes Friday schooling fee). Submit stabling requests with your entry. Specify groups/barn/trainer to stable with.
- Place hay (\$11/bale)/shavings (\$10/bag) orders through www.horseshowsonline.com. Contact Lulu Wheeler if you have questions: (703) 203-3298.

#### **Entries**

- Hunter Entry fees: Pre-Entry: \$20/class. Post Entry: \$25/class.
- Jumper Entry fees: Pre-Entry: \$22/class. Post Entry: \$27/class. (\*Except Classes #74, 77, 81, 84, 87)
- Jumper Classes 74, 77, 81, 84, 87 are Pre-Entry: \$27/class or Post Entry: \$32/class, with \$5 of each entry fee added to the prize money and paid to four places: 40%, 30%, 20%,10%.
- Pre-Entries must be submitted online by July 26th at midnight.
- \$20 Office Fee per mount. Entries scratched after the closing date will not be charged.
- Enter Online at www.horseshowsonline.com
- Show Office: All entries must provide a <u>physical copy</u> of their negative Coggins Test report for the show office to keep, an open check, and a signed release to receive a back number.

#### **Awards**


- All Classes will receive ribbons through sixth place.
- Champion & Reserve Champion ribbons and trophies for each division.
- BHSA Points shall be scored double points based on the number of exhibitors for the BHSA program and count in addition to the exhibitor's Top 10 Shows. VHSA Points shall be awarded normally based on the number of exhibitors for the VHSA Assoc. program.
- Special Awards for the Best Child Rider on a Hunter Pony, Best Junior Rider on a Hunter Horse, Best Adult Rider on a Hunter Horse and the Jumper Style Award.

#### Responsibilities

- The Battlefield Horse Show Association, the Winslett Advantage, Rose Mount Farm, their officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, rider, guest, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at the show. Any equine activity, sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities. This complies with the Virginia Equine Liability Act (3.2-6200 thru 3.2-6203 as amended of the Code of Virginia), which is hereby incorporated by reference.
- Exhibitors show at their own risk. Participants and spectators alike understand that horses are inherently unpredictable and dangerous, and that equipment and ground conditions are equally unpredictable; and knowingly choose to participate and/or spectate, taking full responsibility for this choice. Entry onto the grounds constitutes knowledge and agreement with this policy.
- All dogs must be leashed while on show grounds.
- Show management reserves the right to change rings, combine, cancel, split classes or change Jumper scoring tables; and to refuse any entry or to change officials.

#### **Travel Directions**

Use the Entrance at the end of the stalls if taking stalls or parking in front of the stall area.

Use the main entrance and first open gate into the front field for most day parking.


**FROM RICHMOND:** Take Interstate 95 North to Exit 126 to Route 1 North. Go North for one mile on Route 1 to Route 208. Turn left on Route 208, five miles to the show grounds on the left.

**FROM WASHINGTON:** Take Interstate 95 South to Exit 126. Take Route 1 North for one mile. Turn left on Route 208, five miles to the show grounds on the left.

**FROM WARRENTON:** Take Route 17 East to Fredericksburg. Take Interstate 95 off of Route 17 going South. Go about four miles to Exit 126. Take Route 1 North for one mile. Turn left on Route 208, five miles to the show grounds on the left.

**FROM CHARLOTTESVILLE/CULPEPER:** Take Route 3 East to Fredericksburg. Take Interstate 95 South for about two miles, take Exit 126. Take Route 1 North for one mile. Turn left on Route 208, five miles to the show grounds on the left. **ALTERNATE ROUTE:** Take Route 3 East to Brock Road, Route 613. Turn right, go about 15 miles to Route 208, Courthouse Road, turn left. Go about 1 mile. Show grounds on right.





Held in memory of BHSA founding board member, Forrest Tayloe Linton (1965-1999). Son of Pat & Charles Linton of Woodpecker Farm in Caroline County, Forrest passed away following a riding accident in 1999. He is remembered as a fun-loving, kind Virginia gentleman. His sportsmanship and contribution to BHSA is memorialized by these special classes.

♦ \$500 Forrest Linton Memorial Classic (FLC): Open only to horses. No restrictions on riders. A two-round Classic judged as a hunter class using numeric scoring. The second round will be a Handy Hunter round and judged on promptness and handiness without affecting performance and style. A minimum of 10 riders, if available, to return for the second round. Jump heights to be 2'6" and 3', rider's choice.

♦ \$500 Forrest Linton Pony Memorial Classic (FLPC): Open to all ponies. Riders must be Juniors. A two-round Classic judged as a hunter class using numeric scoring. Jump heights to be 2' or 2'6", rider's choice. The second round will be a Handy Hunter round and judged on promptness and handiness without affecting performance and style.

\*See BHSA Rules for full class specifications. \*\* If a rider goes off course, has a fall, or 3 refusals in the first round, then they are disqualified from the Class altogether and cannot jump the 2nd round, nor get a ribbon. If the disqualification occurs in the 2nd round, then the rider is still eligible for an award, but will only receive a score for the first round. \*\*\*Neck sashes to be awarded through 6th place.
