

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Show management reserves the right to combine, cancel and split classes as it deems necessary for the betterment of the competition. Management also reserves the right to change rings depending on entries.
- Southwest Virginia Equestrian Productions, it's staff, officials, SWVHJA or VHSA will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, groom or animal at the show.
- All exhibitors must wear ASTM approved head gear at all times when mounted on the show grounds.

<u>Entries</u>: All exhibitors must provide the show office with a current negative coggins report for each horse brought on the show grounds. Entry form must be filled out completely, including all signatures, and must be accompanied by an open check before back numbers may be picked up. **Online entries are greatly encouraged via www.horseshowsonline.com**

<u>Schooling</u>: Schooling will be permitted starting at 1pm the day before the show until 7pm. Schooling will also be available prior to the start of the show on the day of competition as determined by the course designer and/or manager.

<u>Coggins</u>: All exhibitors must provide the show office with a current negative coggins repor for each horse brought onto the show grounds, regardless if they are showing. If the horse is showing, then the coggins must be shown prior to picking up back number.

<u>Awards</u>: Six ribbons will be awarded in each class. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded in each division. Classics will place through sixth. Derbies will place through eighth.

We Offer:

Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP)

The purpose of the Thoroughbred Incentive Program is to recognize and reward Thoroughbreds in a second career. Thoroughbreds winning awards are recognized through the Winners page, where the winners of each T.I.P. award at shows are listed. In addition, the data provided by the results reported by shows supports the existence of the program by demonstrating how many horses are participating T.I.P.'s only "points" program is the Performance Awards, which are 100% self-reported by the owner based on participation at all shows. That includes T.I.P. classes and non-T.I.P. classes at any show. So the name of the division has no effect on Performance Award points. Our Thoroughbred Hunter divisision will qualify you for T.I.P. Special Hunter Division. In additional, for purposes of qualifying for T.I.P. Championships, a horse can show in any division at a House Mountain show and qualify for T.I.P. Championships in the discipline and at the height they showed.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

Hunter/Equitation

GREEN HUNTER - Open to horses in their first or second year of showing over fences at 2'6" or higher. To be eligible for green hunter status, horses may not have shown over fences 2'6" or higher prior to the current competition year. Fences to be 2'6" and 3'. Both heights must be offered and judged together. A horse is eligible for reinstatement of their 1st green year if they have not shown at more than 3 shows over fences at 2'6" or higher prior to August 1st of the competition year upon application to the SWVHJA office. The application is reviewed by the Board of Directors. Horses are eligible for 1 reinstatement of Green status. SWWHJA recognized.

LOW HUNTER - Open to horses and ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'. If there are fewer than 3 horses in the Low Hunter Division, it may be combined with the Working Hunter Division. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered division. Results MUST notate which division the horse was entered.

WORKING HUNTER - Open to horses. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be offered at 3'3" and/or 3'6" at the discretion of show management. If there are fewer than 3 horses in the Working Hunter Division, it may be combined with the Low Hunter Division. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered division. Results MUST notate which division the horse was entered.

OPEN/VHSA WORKING HUNTER - Open to animals that are not entered in a pony division at the same show. As a clarification, any animal that competes in a VHSA Associate recognized horse division is ineligible to compete in any VHSA Associate Pony Division at the same show. The VHSA will only accept points for the Working Hunter Division. If a show does not have a Working Hunter Division, but does have an Open Division then we will accept those points toward the Working Hunter Division as long as there are at least three Working Hunter exhibitors competing in the Division and they meet the VHSA division specifications. In order to accrue VHSA Associate points the height for this division shall be no lower than 2'6". The Working Hunter Division can be combined with the Green Hunter Horse Division and the Thoroughbred Hunter Division. It is the Show Secretary's responsibility to indicate on the results which division each horse's points should be awarded to. At the VHSA Associate Championship Horse Show the Jump Height for this Division will be 3'.

CHILDRENS HUNTER - Open to juniors mounted on horses. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'. Management may combine this division with the Adult Amateur Hunter division if there are fewer than 3 entries.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER - Open to adult amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. Fences 3'. Management may combine this division with the Children's Hunter division if there are fewer than 3 entries. Ponies shown by adults may not be shown in the Pony Hunter Division at the same horse show.

BEGINNER EQUITATION – Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences 2' in height. No oxers permitted. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights exceeding 2'. This division will not count against rider's 2 year eligibility for the Intermediate Hunter division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Simple changes are allowed. Division may be split between juniors and adults at the discretion of show management. Division may be combined with the Pre-Beginner Equitation division at Management's discretion if entries warrant. If divisions are combined, fence materials and course MUST be limited to the same material as the Pre-Beginner division.'

 $HOPEFUL\ HUNTER\ -\ Open\ to\ all\ horses\ and\ ponies.\ Judged\ on\ performance,\ manners\ and\ way\ of\ going.\ Fences\ 2'3''.$

INTERMEDIATE HUNTER - Open to Juniors or Amateurs in their first or second year of showing, on horses or ponies, excluding the Pre-Beginner and Beginner Equitation divisions. Fences 2'3". Riders who show at 2'6" or above in their first year forfeit a second Intermediate year. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. The rider may not jump higher than 2'6" at the same horse show.

SMALL/MEDIUM PONY HUNTER - Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult in any recognized division at the same horse show. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Small ponies (not to exceed 12.2h) to jump 2', medium ponies (over 12.2h - not to exceed 13.2h) to jump 2'3". Divisions must be offered split, but if there are not three ponies in either the Small/Medium or Large Pony Divisions, the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

LARGE PONY HUNTER - Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult in any recognized division at the same horse show. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Large ponies (over 13.2h - not to exceed 14.2h) to jump 2'6". Divisions must be offered split, but if there are not three ponies in either the Small/Medium or Large Pony divisions, the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

SPECIAL ADULT HUNTER - Open to Adult Amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Fences to be 2'6" or 2'9". Both heights must be offered and judged together. Related distances between two jumps should be no less than 60' (4 strides). Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Horse/rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2'9" at the same horse show. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the pony hunter division at the same horse show. The Special Adult Hunter division and the Special Children's Hunter division may be combined if there are fewer than 3 in either section.

 ${\sf SPECIAL\ CHILDREN'S\ HUNTER\ -\ Same\ specs\ as\ the\ Special\ Adult\ Hunter,\ except\ open\ to\ junior\ riders.}$

THOROUGHBRED HUNTER – Limited to horses who are registered or eligible to be registered with the Jockey Club. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. To be shown at 2'6" or 3' in height. Both heights must be offered and judged together.

PLEASURE HUNTER 18'-2' - Open to all horses and ponies. Judged on performance, manners and way of going. Fences to be 18" and 2'. No oxers

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS CONTINUED

VHSA CHILDREN'S/JUNIOR EQUITATION - Open to Juniors mounted on horses. The judges may select at least one-fourth of the class to show at a walk, trot, and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion. Jump heights can be determined by each show. Shows are allowed to combine any of the three Equitation classes, however, the secretary must specify on the results sheet by each rider's name as to which class points should be applied to (i.e., Pony, Junior or Adult). A rider can only participate in one Associate Equitation Class per show, with the exception of the VHSA Equitation on the Flat Class. The Associate Equitation Classes cannot be a part of the "Regular" VHSA Equitation Medal Classes, however, they can be a part of any other Equitation Class, for example: XYZ Horse Show Association/VHSA Associate Pony Equitation Class and must be listed in the horse show's Prize List as such. The rider must be a VHSA member or the points will not count towards the Associate year-end Championship. If anyone shows in this class and is not a member they will not receive points, nor will anyone be moved up in placement due to a non-member showing in that particular class. Equitation Classes at the Associate Championship Horse Show will be double points. In order to accrue VHSA Associate points the height for this class shall be no lower than 2'6". At the VHSA Associate Championship Horse Show the Jump Height for this Class will be 3'.

VHSA ADULT AMATEUR EQUITATION - Open to Adult Amateurs mounted on horses. The judges may select at least one-fourth of the class to show at a walk, trot, and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion. Jump heights can be determined by each show. Shows are allowed to combine any of the three Equitation classes, however, the secretary must specify on the results sheet by each rider's name as to which class points should be applied to (i.e., Pony, Junior or Adult). A rider can only participate in one Associate Equitation Class per show, with the exception of the VHSA Equitation on the Flat Class. The Associate Equitation Classes cannot be a part of the "Regular" VHSA Equitation Medal Classes, however, they can be a part of any other Equitation Class, for example: XYZ Horse Show Association/VHSA Associate Pony Equitation Class and must be listed in the horse show's Prize List as such. The rider must be a VHSA member or the points will not count towards the Associate year-end Championship. If anyone shows in this class and is not a member they will not receive points, nor will anyone be moved up in placement due to a non-member showing in that particular class. Equitation Classes at the Associate Championship Horse Show will be double points. In order to accrue VHSA Associate points the height for this class shall be no lower than 2'6". At the VHSA Associate Championship Horse Show the Jump Height for this Class will be 3'.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 14 & Under - Open to riders who have not reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 15-17 and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 15-17 - Open to riders who have reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year, but not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1- 19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 14 & under and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

ADULT EQUITATION ON THE FLAT - Open to amateurs 18 years of age and older. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the flat. Riders must stay within their age group if classes are split by age.

VHSA PONY EQUITATION - Open to Juniors mounted on ponies. The judges may select at least one-fourth of the class to show at a walk, trot, and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion. Jump heights can be determined by each show. Shows are allowed to combine any of the three Equitation classes, however, the secretary must specify on the results sheet by each rider's name as to which class points should be applied to (i.e., Pony, Junior or Adult). A rider can only participate in one Associate Equitation Class per show, with the exception of the VHSA Equitation on the Flat Class. The Associate Equitation Classes cannot be a part of the "Regular" VHSA Equitation Medal Classes, however, they can be a part of any other Equitation Class, for example: XYZ Horse Show Association/VHSA Associate Pony Equitation Class and must be listed in the horse show's Prize List as such. The rider must be a VHSA member or the points will not count towards the Associate year-end Championship. If anyone shows in this class and is not a member they will not receive points, nor will anyone be moved up in placement due to a non-member showing in that particular class. Equitation Classes at the Associate Championship Horse Show will be double points. In order to accrue VHSA Associate points the heights for this class shall be no lower than small 2', medium 2'3", and large 2' 6". At the VHSA Associate Championship Horse Show the Jump Heights for this Class will be Small - 2', Medium - 2'3", Large - 2'9".

PRE-BEGINNER EQUITATION - Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences less than 2' in height. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights of 2' or above. This division will not count against rider's one year eligibility for the Beginner Equitation division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Simple changes are allowed. Division may be combined with the Beginner Equitation division at Management's discretion if warrant. Fence materials limited to: rails, small flower boxes or brush. Ground line material may not make jump wider than it is high. Course to be a minimum of 6 obstacles. Fence height 18". No oxers permitted.

LEADLINE - Open to riders six years of age and under. Riders may not cross enter into any other class at the horse show.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION: Open to riders 12 years of age and under. To be judged on rider's position and control. Riders may not cross enter into the SWVHJA Beginner Equitation or any division with fences over 2'. The division consists of one walk/trot class, one walk/trot/canter class, and one over fences class with fences not to exceed 18".

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER: Open to horses and ponies ridden by children 12 years and under, however, shows may specify a lower age limit, i.e., 10 years and under. The division will consist of three (3) classes, two over fence classes and a walk, trot, canter under saddle class. Short Stirrup riders, ponies and horses may not cross enter into any other VHSA Associate Division or a VHSA Associate rated Equitation Class with the exception of VHSA Associate Junior Equitation On The Flat and Pleasure Pony or Pleasure Horse at any show in which they exhibit in the Short Stirrup Division. Short Stirrup riders will be limited to no more than two (2) entries in the Short Stirrup Division at any one horse shows, but should be no lower than 18" and no higher than 2' with a minimum of four (4) jumps. The Short Stirrup division cannot be combined with any other Division. At the year-end Championship show Short Stirrup riders may cross enter into the Equitation on the Flat, Pleasure Horse or Pleasure Pony Division. At the year-end Championship show Short Stirrup ponies and horses may cross enter into the Equitation on the Flat, Pleasure Horse, Pleasure Pony and any non-point division, i.e., Special Hunters.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS CONTINUED

Medal Classes

SWVHJA HUNTER SEAT MEDAL - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December1st of the calendar year. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3' that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50% same horse must be used for both phases. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Hunter Seat Medal Finals. MUST BE A SWVHJA MEMBER TO COMPETE IN THE CLASS.

SWWHJA ADULT MEDAL - Same specs as for the SWWHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class, except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Hunter Seat Medal. SWWHJA Adult Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Adult Medal Finals. MUST BE A SWWHJA MEMBER TO COMPETE IN THE CLASS.

HOLLINS MEDAL - Open to junior and adult amateur riders who have not qualified for the SWHJA Hunter Seat Medal, SWWHJA Adult Medal, or the Oakridge Medal during the existing or previous year; qualifiers for the SWWHJA Pony medal are still eligible. The class will consist of 2 phases, each counting for 50% of the total score. First phase shall be shown over a course of fences and will not contain a combination. The second phase will be a flat phase, shown at the walk, trot, and canter both directions of the ring. The same horse must be used for both phases. Martingales are permitted in the flat phase.

SWEET BRIAR COLLEGE MEDAL - Open to juniors and amateurs. To be shown over a course of no less than 6 jumps at 2'9". Course must include 2 changes of direction, and may contain an in and out. The judge will then have the option of testing the top 4 riders. Tests 1-10 may be used. The same horse must be used in both phases. Three competitors must complete the course for points to count. Riders may not have shown in a 3'6" or higher Equitation medal class, and may not jump higher than 2'9" at the same show. This class may be combined with other classes of similar specifications. Not recognized or sanctioned by SWM-JJA.

OAK RIDGE MEDAL CLASS - Open to juniors and amateur riders. Over fences phase will consist of a USEF-type equitation, A-O/Jr. jumper course of at least ten fences at a height of 3'-3'3" with spreads to 4'. Flat phase to count 50% & must run first. No martingales in the flat phase. Top ten riders will be called back for the over fences phase. Jump order is determined by judge. Judge may require additional tests from USEF tests 1-19. Minimum of 3 to fill class.

SWWHJA PONY MEDAL - Open to current junior members of SWWHJA mounted on ponies. To be shown over a minimum of 6 jumps at the appropriate heights. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase

to count 50%. The same pony must be used for both phases. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If no Pony Medal is offered, a rider may compete on a pony in the Hunter Seat Medals in one show, nor can they participate in both aforementioned finals in one year. SWVHJA Pony Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Pony Medal Finals. MUST BE A SWVHJA MEMBER TO COMPETE IN THE CLASS.

VHSA/EMO ADULT AMATEUR MEDAL CLASSES: Open to Senior Members of the VHSA. Three exhibitors are required to fill the class and three exhibitors must complete the course. Course must have no less than six obstables at 3", must include a combination, two changes of direction and must have at least two of the following inside the course: A roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, or a long ride to a single jump.Riders may not compete in any class where the fence height exceeds 3'3" (1.0m) with the exception of the Childrens/ Adult Jumper division, at the same show, where a rider may not jump higher than 3'9" (1.15m). Judge must call back at least four exhibitors for further testing over fences. This VHSA/EMO Adult Amateur Medal Class can be combined with the VHSA/EMO Children's Medal Class. Six Ribbons.

VHSA/EMO CHILDREN'S MEDAL CLASS: Open to Junior Members of the VHSA. Three exhibitors are required to fill the class and three exhibitors must complete the course. Course must have no less than six obstables at 3', must include a combination, two changes of direction and must have at least two of the following inside the course: A roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, or a long ride to a single jumps. Riders may not compete in any class where the fence height exceeds 3'3" (1.0m) with the exception of the Childrens/Adult Jumper division, at the same show, where a rider may not jump higher than 3'9" (1.15m). The Judge must call back at least four exhibitors for further testing over fences. This VHSA/EMO Children's Medal Class can be combined with the VHSA/EMO Adult Amateur Medal Class. Six Ribbons.

VHSA/EMO CHILDRENS PONY EQUITATION MEDAL CLASS: -Open to Junior Members of the VHSA. Three exhibitors are required to fill the class and three exhibitors must complete the class. Course must have no less than six obstacles and must have at least two of the following inside the course: A roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, or a long ride to a single jump. Test must be included in the original course. Small and Medium ponies must jump 2'0" and Large Ponies must jump 2'6". Riders may not compete in any class where the fence height exceeds 2'6" at the same show. The VHSA/EMO Children's Pony Medal may run concurrently with the Small, Medium and Large Children's Pony Division, and may be combined with the MHSA Children's Pony Medal Class. Six Ribbons.

Jumpers

NOVICE CHILDREN'S/ADULT JUMPER (2'6") - Open to children and adult amateurs in their first or second year of showing in jumper classes at 0.75m or higher as of December 1st of the current competition year. Riders in this division may only cross enter into Novice Jumper, if eligible, and Low Jumper at the same show. This division shall be no lower than 0.70m and no higher than 0.75m. USEF Tables I-IV may be used.

VHSA THOROUGHBRED JUMPER - The VHSA Associate Thoroughbred Jumper Division is limited to horses who are registered with or are eligible to be registered with the Jockey Club. In order to accrue VHSA Associate points the height for this division shall be no lower than 2'6" and no higher than 3'0". Spreads shall be no greater than height of the fence. The VHSA Associate Thoroughbred Jumper Division may not be combined with any other VHSA Associate recognized division with

3'0". Spreads shall be no greater than height of the fence. The VHSA Associate Thoroughbred Jumper Division may not be combined with any other VHSA Associate recognized division with the exception of the Low Jumpers when necessary. Horses must be registered with the VHSA and owners must be current VHSA members in order to accrue points towards VHSA Associate year-end awards.

LOW JUMPER - - This division shall be offered at no lower than .80 and no higher than .85m but may be only offered at one height at any particular horse show. Spreads shall be no greater than the height of the fence. USEF Tables I-IV may be used.

CHILD/ADULT JUMPER - Open to horses or ponies ridden by a junior or adult amateur exhibitor. Fences .95 to 1.05 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

LEVEL 2 JUMPER – Fences .95 – 1.0 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used

LEVEL 3 JUMPER - Fences over 1.0 – 1.10 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

MODIFIED/LEVEL 4 JUMPER - Fence heights in each class shall be no lower than 1.10m (3'6") in height and no greater than 1.20m (4') in height. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

1.00M OPEN JUMPER - Fence heights in each class shall be at 1.00m in height. Spreads shall be no greater than the height of the fence. Open to professionals, juniors & amateurs.

1.15M OPEN JUMPER - Fence heights in each class shall be at 1.15m in height. Spreads shall be no greater than the height of the fence. Open to professionals, juniors & amateurs.

Eight ribbons will be awarded for this class. Prize money will be distributed to first through eighth placings. Riders must be entered in this class by noon Saturday, April 13 Entry fee \$50.00 Prize Money: 30%, 20%, 15%, 12%, 10%, 6%, 4%, 3%

SWVEP \$500 NON-PRO HUNTER DERBY: Offered at 2', 2'3", 2'6", and 2'9'. All heights include oxers. Open to junior and amateur riders mounted on horses and ponies. This derby will be a two-round format. It will consist of two rounds, one Classic Hunter and one Handy Hunter. Major penalties (falls, 3 refusals, off course, etc.) will result in elimination. Two-round format:

Round 1: The Classic Hunter Round, consisting of 8-10 fences, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going.

Top 12 return for Round 2: Handy Hunter Round, consisting of 8-10 fences, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. A horse/rider may not jump decorations or other obstacles in order to create a shorter track.

Not all divisions will be offered at this show. You MUST be a member of SWVEP to compete in those divisions

Introductory Equitation - Open to junior and amateur riders, mounted on horses or ponies in his/her 1st year of showing whom have never shown over fences. Division classes to consist of: 1) walk equitation 2) walk/trot equitation 3) walk/ trot/ individual canter. Judged on position, control, guidance, and suitability of mount.

Novice Equitation - Open to junior and amateur riders, mounted on horses or ponies in his/ her 1st or 2nd year of showing who have never shown over fences higher than 18". Division classes to consist of 1) walk/ trot/ canter 2) poles course 3) poles course. Course can not to exceed 5 poles. Trotting not to be penalized. Judged on position, control, guidance, and suitability of mount.

Maiden Equitation- Open to junior and amateur riders, mounted on horses or ponies ,that have shown for no more than 3 years or over fences higher than 2′. Division classes to consist of 1) walk/trot/canter 2) cross rails course 3) cross rails course. Courses to be a minimum of 7 fences set at 18″. Simple changes not to be penalized. Judged, on position, control, and guidance.

Limit Equitation: Open to junior and amateur riders, mounted on horses or ponies, whom have shown for no more than 4 years or over fences higher than 2'3. Division classes to consist of 1) walk/trot/canter 2) course A 3) course B. Courses to be a minimum of 7 fences set at 2'. No oxers permitted. Judged on position, control, and guidance.

Open Equitation: Open junior and amateur riders, mounted on horses or ponies, whom have not shown over fences higher than 2'6. Division classes to consist of 2 courses at 2'3 and 3) walk/ trot/canter class. Courses to be a Minimum of 7 fences set at 2'3. At least 3 jumps must be oxers. Judged on position, control, and guidance. 2 entries required to fill this class.

Pony equitation on the flat: Open juniors or amateurs mounted on ponies. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both directions. Judged on position, control, and guidance. Can be combined with Jr. Equitation on the flat if fewer than entries.

Junior Equitation on the flat: Open to junior riders mounted on horses. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both directions. Judged on position, control, and guidance. Can be combined with Pony equitation on the flat.

Adult Equitation on the flat: Open to adults on horses or ponies (not entered in a pony division). To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter in both directions. Judged on position, control, and guidance. Can be combined with Jr. Equitation on the flat.

Student Equitation: Open to junior or amateur riders mounted on a horse or pony owned by a school or lesson program. Riders may not have shown over fences 2'6 or higher. Division classes to consist of 2 over fences 3) walk/trot/canter. Courses to be a minimum of 7 fences set at 2'3 and 2'6 (rider's choice). Simple changes will not be penalized. Judged on position, control and guidance.

Child/Adult Hunter: Open to junior or amateur riders mounted on horses. Riders may not have shown over fences higher than 2'6. Horse and rider combination can't compete at 2'9 or higher at the same show. Division classes to consist of 2 over fences and an under saddle class. Courses to be a minimum of 7 fences set at 2'6". Division will be split if there are 3 entries in the Adult and 3 in the Children. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going.

Future Hunter Horse: Open to horses in their 1st or 2nd year of showing over fences that have not shown over fences higher than 2'.Division classes to consist of 2 courses and an under saddle. Courses to be a minimum of 7 jumps offered at 2', 2'3, or 2'6. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going.

Future Hunter Pony: Open to ponies in their 1st or 2nd year of showing over fences that have never shown over fences 18" or higher. Division classes to consist of 2 courses and an under saddle. Courses to be a minimum of 7 jumps offered at 18", 2', 2'3. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going.

Adult Hunter Pleasure- Open to Adult riders mounted on horses or ponies. Classes offered will include; Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. If fewer than 3 entries, Adult Hunter Pleasure may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Division and/ or Pony Pleasure Division. To be judged on manners, suitability, and way of going.

Junior Pleasure Horse- Open to junior riders mounted on horses. Classes offered will include; Walk/ Go as you please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. If fewer than 2 entries, Jr Pleasure Horse may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Division and/or the Pony Pleasure Division. To be judged on manners, suitability, and way of going.

Pleasure Pony Hunter - Open to ponies shown on the flat ridden by a Junior. Classes offered will include; Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. If fewer than 3 entries, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse division and/ or the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. A pony can be considered a horse at a show if the pony is not exhibited in a pony restricted division such as pony. Therefore, it is acceptable for an adult to ride a pony in the Adult Pleasure Division as long as the pony is not shown in pony restricted division at the same show.

Small/Medium & Large Pony Hunter - Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult. Division to consist of 2 over fences and an under saddle. Courses to be a minimum of 7 fences. Small ponies (not to exceed 12.2h) to jump 18", medium ponies (over 12.2h - not to exceed 13.2h) to jump 2', large ponies (over 13.2h-14.2) to jump 2'3. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Large and small/ medium divisions must be offered split, but if there are fewer than three ponies in each section the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

SWVEP Jr/Amateur Medal: Open to junior or amateur riders, mounted on horses. Riders may not have not shown over 2'6. Fences to be offered at 2'3 & 2'6. Course must include at least 2 changes of

direction and must have a minimum of 7 fences. All riders without a major fault to be called back on the flat. Both phases to count 50%. USEF Equitation tests 1-6 & 9 may be used. To be judged on position, control, and guidance. The same horse must be used for both phases. 3 riders must complete the course for points to count.

SWVEP Pony Medal: Open to junior riders mounted on ponies. Riders may not have shown over 2'6. Small ponies to jump 18', medium ponies to jump 2', large ponies to jump 2'3". Course must include at least 2 changes of direction and must have a minimum 7 fences. All riders without a major fault to be called back on the flat. Both phases to count 50%. USEF Equitation tests 1-6, & 9 may be used. To be judged on position, control, and guidance. The same horse must be used for both phases. 3 riders must complete the course for points to count.

SWVEP Beginner Medal: Open to junior and amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Riders may not have competed in any medal final previously. Riders may not have shown over 2'6". Fences 2'. Course must include at least 2 changes of direction and must have a minimum of 7 fences. All riders without a major fault to be alled back on the flat. Both phases to count 50%. USEF Equitation tests 1-5 may be used. To be judged on position, control, and guidance. Same horse must be used for both phases. 3 riders must complete the course for points to count.

SWVHJA DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS 2024

Point accumulation will run from December 1st through the Annual Show/Medal Finals.

For those divisions with an * please see Rule IX Chapter VII for reinstatement requirements.

EQUITATION

2024 ONLY PRE- BEGINNER EQUITATION * - Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences less than 2' in height. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights of 2' or above. This division will not count against rider's one year eligibility for the Beginner Equitation division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Simple changes are allowed. Division may be combined with the Beginner Equitation division at Management's discretion if warrant. Fence materials limited to: rails, small flower boxes or brush. Ground line material may not make jump wider than it is high. Course to be a minimum of 6 obstacles. Fence height 18". No oxers permitted.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION: Open to riders 12 years of age and under. To be judged on rider's position and control. Riders may not cross enter into the SWVHJA Beginner Equitation or any division with fences over 2'. The division consists of one walk/trot class, one walk/trot/canter class, and one over fences class with fences not to exceed 18".

BEGINNER EQUITATION * Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences 2' in height. No oxers permitted. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence Molly Mheights exceeding 2'. This division will not count against rider's 2 year eligibility for the Intermediate Hunter division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Simple changes are allowed. Division may be split between juniors and adults at the discretion of show management. Division may be combined with the Pre Beginner Equitation division at Management's discretion if entries warrant. If divisions are combined, fence materials and course MUST be limited to the same material as the Pre Beginner division. Fence height 2'.

BEGINNER EQUITATION: Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences 18" or 2' in height. No oxers permitted. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights exceeding 2'. This division will not count against rider's 2 year eligibility for the Intermediate Hunter division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Simple changes are allowed. Division may be split between juniors and adults at the discretion of show management.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 15-17 - Open to riders who have reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year, but not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 14 & under and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 14 & Under - Open to riders who have not reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 15-17 and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

ADULT EQUITATION ON THE FLAT - Open to amateurs 18 years of age and older. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the flat. Riders must stay within their age group if classes are split by age.

MEDALS

SWVHJA HUNTER SEAT MEDAL - *MUST BE A MEMBER TO COMPETE IN THE CLASS*. Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3' that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. Same horse must be used for both phases. Four Three entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to and complete the class. If there are fewer than three entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Hunter Seat Medal Finals.

SWVHJA ADULT MEDAL - *MUST BE A MEMBER TO COMPETE IN THE CLASS*. Same specs as for the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class, except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. If there are fewer than three entries, this class can be combined with the Hunter Seat Medal. SWVHJA Adult Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Adult Medal Finals.

PONY MEDAL - *MUST BE A MEMBER TO COMPETE IN THE CLASS*. Open to current junior members of SWVHJA mounted on ponies. To be shown over a minimum of 6 jumps at the appropriate heights. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. The same pony must be used for both phases. Three entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to and complete the class. If no Pony Medal is offered, a rider may compete on a pony in the Hunter Seat Medal. A rider cannot compete in both the Pony and the Hunter Seat Medals in one show, nor can they participate in both aforementioned finals in one year. SWVHJA Pony Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Pony Medal Finals.

HUNTER

SMALL/MEDIUM PONY HUNTER—Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult in any recognized division at the same horse show. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Small ponies (not to exceed 12.2h) to jump 2', medium ponies (over 12.2h—not to exceed 13.2h) to jump 2'3". Divisions must be offered split, but if there are not three ponies in either the Small/Medium or Large Pony divisions, the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

SMALL/MEDIUM PONY HUNTER - Open to Small ponies (not to exceed 12.2h) and Medium ponies (over 12.2h - not to exceed 13.2h) ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult in any recognized division at the same horse show. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 2' or 2'3". Divisions must be offered split, but if there are not three ponies in either the Small/Medium or Large Pony divisions, the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

LARGE PONY HUNTER - Open to ponies ridden by juniors. Ponies shown in this division may not be shown by an adult in any recognized division at the same horse show. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Large ponies (over 13.2h - not to exceed 14.2h) to jump 2'6". Divisions must be offered split, but if there are not three ponies in either the Small/Medium or Large Pony divisions, the divisions must be combined. Lines less than 72' must be set on appropriate distances.

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER: Open to horses and ponies ridden by children 12 years and under, however, shows may specify a lower age limit, i.e., 10 years and under. The division will consist of three (3) classes, two over fence classes and a walk, trot, canter under saddle class. Short Stirrup riders, ponies and horses may not cross enter into any other division shown over 2' or a SWVHJA recognized Equitation Class with the exception of Junior Equitation On The Flat (14 and Under) and Pleasure Pony or Pleasure Horse at any show in which they exhibit in the Short Stirrup Division. Short Stirrup riders will be limited to no more than two (2) entries in the Short Stirrup Division at

any one horse show. The jump height for this division shall be decided by individual horse shows, but should be no lower than 18" and no higher than 2' with a minimum of four (4) jumps. The Short Stirrup division cannot be combined with any other Division.

INTERMEDIATE HUNTER * - Open to Juniors or Amateurs in their first or second year of showing, on horses or ponies, excluding the Pre-Beginner and Beginner Equitation divisions. Fences 2'3". Riders who show at 2'6" or above in their first year forfeit a second Intermediate year. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. The rider may not jump higher than 2'6" at the same horse show.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER - Open to juniors mounted on horses. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'. Management may combine this division with the Adult Amateur Hunter division if there are fewer than 3 entries.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER - Open to adult amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. Fences 3'. Management may combine this division with the Children's Hunter division if there are fewer than 3 entries.

LOW HUNTER - Open to horses and ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'. If there are fewer than 3 horses in the Low Hunter Division, it may be combined with the Working Hunter Division. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered division. Results MUST notate which division the horse was entered.

WORKING HUNTER - Open to horses. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be offered at 3'3" and/or 3'6" at the discretion of show management. If there are fewer than 3 horses in the Working Hunter Division, it may be combined with the Low Hunter Division. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered division. Results MUST notate which division the horse was entered.

SPECIAL ADULT HUNTER - Open to Adult Amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Fences to be 2'6" or 2'9". Both heights must be offered and judged together. Related distances between two jumps should be no less than 60' (4 strides). Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Horse/rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2'9" at the same horse show. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the pony hunter division at the same horse show. The Special Adult Hunter division and the Special Children's Hunter division may be combined if there are fewer than 3 in either section.

SPECIAL CHILDREN'S HUNTER - Same specs as the Special Adult Hunter, except open to junior riders.

GREEN HUNTER * - Open to horses in their first or second year of showing over fences at 2'6" or higher. To be eligible for green hunter status, horses may not have shown over fences 2'6" or higher prior to the current competition year. Fences to be 2'6" and 3'. Both heights must be offered and judged together.

THOROUGHBRED HUNTER - Limited to horses who are registered or eligible to be registered with the Jockey Club. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. To be shown at 2'6" or 3' in height. Both heights must be offered and judged together.

PLEASURE

ADULT HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE - Open to horses shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by an Adult. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) It is acceptable for SWVHJA Horse Shows to combine the Adult Hunter Pleasure and the Junior Pleasure Hunter Divisions, however, it is the show secretary's responsibility to indicate on the results which is the Adult rider and which is the Junior rider. If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Division and the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse

division. To be judged on manners, suitability, and way of going. For year end points to accrue, three entries must enter and compete in all three classes of the division.

JUNIOR HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE - Same specs as the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse except open to Junior riders.

HUNTER PLEASURE PONY - Open to ponies shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by a Junior. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse division and Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. A pony can be considered a horse at a show if the pony is not exhibited in a pony restricted division such as pony. Therefore, it is acceptable for an adult to ride a pony in the Adult Pleasure Division as long as the pony is not shown in pony restricted division at the same show.

JUMPER

NOVICE CHILDREN'S/ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER—Open to children and adult amateurs in their first or second year of showing in jumper classes at 0.75m or higher as of December 1st of the current competition year. Riders in this division may only cross enter into Novice Jumper, if eligible, and Low Jumper at the same show. This division shall be no lower than 0.70m and no higher than 0.75m. USEF Tables I IV may be used.

0.75 JUMPER – Fences 0.70-0.75 meters. USEF Tables I-IV may be used.

LOW JUMPER –This division shall be offered at no lower than .80 and no higher than .85m but may be only offered at one height at any particular horse show. Spreads shall be no greater than the height of the fence. USEF Tables I-IV may be used.

CHILDREN'S / ADULT JUMPER – Open to horses or ponies ridden by a junior or adult amateur exhibitor. Fences .95 to 1.05 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

LEVEL 2 JUMPER – Fences .95 – 1.0 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

LEVEL 3 JUMPER – Fences over 1.0 – 1.10 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

LEVEL 4 JUMPER – Fences over 1.10 – 1.20 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

LEVEL 5 JUMPER – Fences over 1.20 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

Record your horse if you expect your points to count toward year-end awards. Horse must be recorded before or during the show from which points are to be earned. Horse's owner must be a current SWVHJA Member.
