GENERAL INFORMATION, HORSE SHOW AND COVID RULES

Conditions of Competition

Jumper classes are judged in accordance with the rules and specifications of the VHSA and USEF Rule Books.

Only current active members in good standing will be eligible to compete in any class.

Riders and horses must have valid VHSA membership numbers for points to count towards VHSA Annual Awards

Registration and Entry Fees

We will be assigning each rider, owner, and horse a permanent membership number. Registration for membership will begin on March 1, you are strongly encouraged to complete all membership papers as soon as possible. **Registration may be done online via our website, via email, fax or regular mail. Forms are available on our website.**

Annual Registration - \$50 per rider required

Entry Policy and Procedures

CVSJA Entry Agreement

Every entry shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that all participants (which include without limitation, the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, handler, the horse, their principals, representatives, or employees): Shall 1. Be subject to the constitution and rules of the association and competition. 2. Agree that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully aware that horse sports and the competition involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death, and by participation that they expressly assume any and all risk of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold the competition and the officials, directors, employees, and agents harmless from and against all claims including for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with competition, whether or not such a claim injury or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees or agents of the competition. The State of Virginia Equine Activity Liability Act limits liability for injury to a person resulting from the "intrinsic dangers of equine activities" and bars claims or recovery for injury, loss, damage, or death of a person resulting from the "intrinsic dangers of equine activities."

Horses will be assigned an annual show tag number, to be used at all CVSJA Shows.

Closing Dates for Entries is **9pm the Monday** prior to each show.

Exhibitors are expected to pre-enter. Entries received after closing date/time are considered late and will be charged \$35 per class. Late entries received will only be accepted providing space is available. You must provide a valid CC number for your entry to be accepted. You will not be charged until after the show and classes have been completed. CC transaction fees have been removed. All Mandatory Fields must be completed for entry acceptance. Scratch fees have been removed.

We are **accepting entries online via our website or the links posted on Facebook.**

- ENTRIES MUST HAVE CURRENT VALID NEGATIVE COGGINS ON FILE PRIOR TO EACH SHOW. **Horses will not be allowed to compete until copy is given to the show secretary**
- **Accounts must be paid in full for each show. All accounts not paid in full (including NSF fees) prior to start of next show will not be allowed to compete.**
- Pre-Entry \$25 per Class, Late Entry \$35 per class. Stakes Classes and Mini Prix \$50 per class.
- Ticketed Warm Up same as class price
- Extra Unjudged trips at the end of divisions \$25 each and may be done only after your judged trips, and if time permits.
- **Stalls must be reserved with show secretary either online or at the show. Barn/stall #'s will be assigned by show management and will be checked.** You MUST use the stall(s) you are assigned. Stall fees \$40 for the day or \$45 for overnight, no bedding provided Tack stalls must be reserved and are billed the same as regular stalls. We will notify you of your stall placement prior to the show. All the barns and stalls have numbers posted on them. A map of the barns is posted on the website.
- Office Fee \$8
- Any returned payments for any reason will be charged a \$50 penalty fee.
- A posted order of go will be established for each class. Trainer names must be submitted with your entry if you are coached by a trainer. This will allow us to appropriately establish ride times with minimal trainer conflicts. Order of go lists will be emailed and posted online the day before the show.
- The show and grounds waiver needs to be signed by all participants. Including Trainers that are not riding. This will be part of the online registration forms.
- Social Distancing must be always a priority. Non-related groups standing or sitting need to keep at least 6 feet apart. Markers to help facilitate this have been established on the show grounds.
- There is plenty of space on the show grounds when parking please keep a minimum of 12 between all vehicles.
- Masks are required while using the rest rooms and are suggested but not required while outdoors. Riders while mounted do not need to wear one.
- Plexiglass has been installed at the show grounds, please keep these partitions between yourselves and our show staff.
- Rider packets with show tags and information will be available for pick up at the secretary stand.
- Jump Courses are emailed prior to the show, but are subject to minor changes. Always double check the course posted at the gate, in case changes were required during the building of the course. Copies will be posted near the ring. Please spread out when viewing.
- Course Walks will be done in small groups, based on established orders of go and trainer groups.
- We will be using Ringside Pro to send text messages with show schedule updates. Everyone is encouraged to sign up for FREE at <https://www.ringsidepro.com/shows>.
- Schooling rings will be open 30 minutes prior to the show.
- There will be hand sanitizer posted by the show and schooling rings. Anyone handling jumps must use this prior to handling the jumps.
- As exhibitor rotations are completed, we will be announcing the next groups to come to schooling areas and show rings.
- Ticketed warm-ups will be held throughout each division. Ticketed warmups must be pre-registered.
- We ask trainers to stay on track with schooling and getting your students to the rings. Please make the gate keepers aware of any problems or conflicts. It is essential to keep the day moving as there are extra warm-up sessions throughout the day.
- Class results will be announced, and ribbons may be picked up at the ribbon tent. The Junior Committee will be handing out ribbons to the winners.
- Show fees will be billed after the show. A charge receipt will be emailed prior to your card being charged.
- All Championship money will be paid through mailed checks after the show.
- Bathrooms will be stocked with hand sanitizers and Lysol spray. It is up to each user to clean surfaces prior to use.
- Pony Club will be offering breakfast and coffee. And a local Food Truck will be on site to provide lunch. These will be in locations that allow social distancing between customers.
- Weather related updates will be sent out as soon as possible but may be as late as 7am the morning of the show. We will do our best to stay on top of weather changes, we will send emails, post on FB, twitter, and our website. **We also use RingSide Pro to send Text Messages to your phones. Sign Up for Free.**

Code of Conduct

Any action(s) against a horse by an exhibitor or other person, which is (are) deemed excessive by a judge, member of the Executive Committee, or CVSJA member, in the competition ring or anywhere on the competition grounds may be punished by official warning, elimination or other sanctions which may be deemed appropriate. Such action(s) could include, but are not limited to excessive use of whip, spurs, poles, or other equipment. A violation of these rules is determined after consultation between members of the Executive Committee or other officials involved and a judge. Competitors found to be in violation of these rules may be eliminated or disqualified from competing that day and may forfeit all entry fees for that competition.

- Poling WILL NOT be permitted on the show grounds.
- Offsets are not allowed.
- The schooling area must contain at least one vertical and one spread fence with standards and cups.
- Multiple Ride competitors will be given priority in "order of go" (as needed) to keep show running smoothly.
- The Steward's or member of the Executive Committee's decision regarding schooling fences, tack and equipment allowed is pursuant to VHSA rules.
- Lunging Allowed in designated areas only.
- Horses must enter and exit the show rings at a walk
- Juniors and Adults may ride ponies.
- Exhibitor's may not approach judges with questions. All questions should be directed to show management.
- Motorized Vehicles of any kind may only be driven by licensed drivers anywhere on the show grounds.
- No horse may be ponied behind a motorized vehicle
- Electrical Installation and connections must meet all state and county code.
- No Sharps allowed in manure pits. Sharps must be placed in proper containers.
- Resolutions of ties are the decision of show management
- No loose dogs/pets are allowed anywhere on the show grounds. All must be on a hand-held leash or tied leash. Management reserves the right to enforce a \$50 fine for non-compliance.

Dress Code

Shows are informal, (excluding Mini-Prix which is full show dress) tall boots, breeches, half chaps, paddock boots, knee straps, polo shirts or rat catchers are acceptable. All shirts must be tucked into breeches, all riders should wear a belt.

- No Full Chaps
- No collarless shirts
- ASTM Approved Helmet must be worn by all riders while mounted on the show grounds.
- Rider may not enter the ring with cell phones or any other communication devices.
- Protective vests may be worn during competitions and should comply with Federation recommendations regarding current ASTM standard F1937 or Certified by the Safety Equipment Institute.

Regular Division Prize Money

\$100 per division distributed to the top three in each division. Champion \$50, Reserve Ch. \$30 and Honorable Mention receives \$20. **Horses must compete in both classes to be eligible for the prize money.**

Points Calculation

A minimum of 2 entries is required to fill a class,
Champion, Reserve and Honorable Mention will be awarded if 3 entries fill both classes.

CVSJA ANNUAL SEASON AWARDS

Division Awards

Puddle, Novice Rider and **Child Adult** divisions are based on highest points accumulated by a rider on a specific horse/rider combination. **Novice Horse, Lows, TB, Schooling, Modified, and Open** divisions are based on highest points earned by a horse in each division.

Champion, Reserve, Honorable Mention receive trophies, ribbons are awarded to the top six. Top Ten in points receive an annual pin.

CVSJA Medal Class

The high point rider receives a custom groom box. Ribbons go to the top 6 high point riders.

“Jerry Streitweiser” Memorial Trophy

Awarded to the winner of the Modified Division in the Mini Prix

Annual High Point Awards

HIGH POINT OVERALL RIDER - Points earned by one rider, all horses, all divisions.

HIGH POINT HORSE – All points earned by a specific horse from all divisions with all riders.

“Rebecca Lipscomb Memorial” HIGH POINT JUNIOR – All points earned by a junior rider from all divisions **3' and higher** and all horses ridden.

HIGH POINT PONY CLUB MEMBER – All points earned by any member of USPC, from any division and all horses ridden.

“Paula Kalinski Trophy” HIGH POINT NOVICE RIDER – All points earned in the Novice Rider division on all horses ridden.

HIGH POINT ADULT AMATEUR – All points earned by a non-novice amateur rider from all divisions and all horses ridden.

HIGH POINT PROFESSIONAL – All points earned from all divisions and all horses ridden.

“Alia Fagerburg” Memorial Trophy – HIGH POINT THOROUGHBRED - All points earned by a Thoroughbred from all classes.

“Ginger Snap” Unicorn Pony Memorial Trophy – HIGH POINT CHILD 12 OR YOUNGER RIDING A PONY – All points earned from any class.

CVSJA Division and Class Information

Regular Division Specifications

Puddle Jumper

.65 Meters

Open to horses and ponies. Horses, ponies and riders in this division may only cross enter into any class lower than 3' if otherwise eligible. Fence height shall not be lower than 2' or greater than 2'3" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table IV, Section 1 Optimum Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off. **Professionals may enter only as unjudged in this division.** Showing in this division does not break novice status.

Novice Horse

.75 Meters

Open to horses and ponies in their 1st or 2nd year of showing in jumper classes at any height higher than 2' as of December 1 of the current show year. Horses may not compete in classes where jump height is higher than 3'. Fence height shall not be lower than 2'3" or greater than 2'6" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table IV, Section 1 Optimum Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off. Season points are awarded to horse owner, are accrued to the horses membership number regardless of rider.

Novice Rider

.75 Meters

Open to children and adult amateurs in their 1st or 2nd year of showing in jumper classes at any height higher than 2' as of December 1 of the current show year. Riders may not compete in classes where jump height is higher than 3'. Fence height shall not be lower than 2'3" or greater than 2'6" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table IV, Section 1 Optimum Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off. Professionals may not compete in this division. Season points are awarded to the rider in this division on any horse.

Open 2'6"

.75 Meters

Open to ponies, horses, and all riders. Fence height shall not be lower than 2'3" or greater than 2'6" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table IV, Section 1 Optimum Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off.

Low Jumper and Low Thoroughbred Jumper

.90 Meters

Open to ponies, horses, and all riders. Fence height shall not be lower than 2'9" or greater than 3' with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table IV, Section 1 Optimum Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off.

The VHSA Associate Thoroughbred Jumper Division is limited to horses that are registered with or are eligible to be registered with the Jockey Club and have a TIPS number. Horses and owners must also be registered current members with VHSA for points to count toward VHSA year-end awards.

Child/Adult Jumper

1.00 Meter

Open to ponies, horses, juniors, and amateurs. Fence height shall not be lower than 3'0" or greater than 3'3" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table II, Section 1, Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off. Professional not allowed.

Open 3'3"

1.00 Meter

Open to ponies, horses, and all riders. Fence height shall not be lower than 3'0" or greater than 3'3" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table II, Section 1 Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off.

Schooling Jumper

1.10 Meters

Open to ponies, horses, and all riders. Fence height shall not be lower than 3'3" or greater than 3'6" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table II, Section 1 Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off.

Modified Jumper

1.20 Meters

Open to ponies, horses, and all riders. Fence height shall not be lower than 3'6" or greater than 4' with spreads not greater than the fence height. Classes in this division include Table II, Section 1 Time First Round, Table II, Section 2(b) Time first jump-off.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS AND SCORING

Table II, Section 2 (b) Time First Jump-off

Timed first round and jump-off, if any, are decided by adding the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. If a competitor is clear in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring and upon audible signal commence the designated jump-off course. If there are no clear rounds, and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide the event of equality of faults.

Table II, Section 1 Time First Round

The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. Horses with clear rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course.

Table IV, Section 1 Optimum Time First Round

The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. Horses with clear rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course. Horses with the time closest to the optimum time (over or under) will be placed accordingly. The optimum time for the course is 4 seconds less than the time allowed.

TIME ALLOWED – The time allowed will be based on a speed of 350 meters per minute. Judges may adjust times as they deem necessary.

TIME TO START – A competitor will have 45 seconds from the time the judge sounds an audible signal to cross between the start markers in the proper direction and start the course. If a competitor does not cross through the start line within the allotted time, the timers will begin counting the time of the jump course immediately as the start clock expires. In classes or (phase of class) where time is not being recorded, competitors will have the 45 seconds to cross the start line or be eliminated.

Notes for riding in a jumper class - Riders must enter and exit the ring at the walk, riders must wait for the buzzer before they begin. Riders should check to make sure all jumps have been properly set from previous round before they start jumping. All jumps have flags, White is on the left, Red is on the right. All jumps have numbers to assist with remembering the course. Riders should check, their Optimum Time and Time Allowed for their division. Always make sure you tell the gate attendant, the class and the division you are riding to ensure judge marks the correct card.

CVSJA Equitation - Walker's Run Contractors Medal Class

Sponsored by Walker's Run Contracting

Open to all Juniors and Adult Amateurs riding horses or ponies. Jump courses will be designed to follow jumper style equitation guidelines. This class is intended to give riders a chance to practice and improve their equitation showing skills and prepare them for the top nationally recognized equitation qualifying classes. Each rider will execute a course of a minimum of 8 jumps as well as ride a flat phase. **Ribbons 1st through 6th will be awarded as well as a Dover Saddlery Gift Certificate to the winner. The judge will provide written feedback for each trip and a brief verbal conversation of rider's performance.** Jump heights will be offered in two classifications 2'6" and a 3'. No horse may jump more than 2 trips. A Year-end award will be given to the high point rider and ribbons will go to the top six points riders. Additionally, our junior committee will vote on most improved junior equitation participant.

Special Class Descriptions

Cross Rails - Exhibitors compete over a course of 9 to 12 jumps. Jump heights are no higher than 18", Class is judged as an optimum time course. Horse/Rider combination may not compete in any other class at the same show. Ribbons from 1 to 8. **Professionals may enter only as an unjudged round.**

Friends of CVSJA \$1,000 Stakes – This class will replace the Modified Division for the May 16th show. The class is a Table 2 Section 2A format. USEF JP146 - Table II, Sec. 2 (a)—The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round, there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults. b. Table II, Sec. 2 (b)—The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred.

Jeanne Dunford Memorial \$1,000 Gambler's Choice - Each jump is assigned a point value and may only be jumped twice. Jumps will range in height from 2' to 4'. We will set hi/low options for many jumps, so novice riders have plenty of obstacles to jump. Riders choose their own path and jump as many jumps as possible in 60 seconds. If a horse has left the ground to a jump when buzzer sounds, that jump will count. If a jump is knocked down, it may not be jumped again. The Joker - the highest jump with most points may be jumped twice, if you clear it you earn the points, if you knock it down the points are deducted from your total score with the most points win.

Prize Money for both \$1,000 classes is distributed as follows:

THE MINI PRIX

The last show of the year is our Mini Prix offering \$2,500 in prize money for the day. Formal Dress Required (Jackets, Breeches and boots, No half chaps). The fee for each class is \$50. You must be pre-registered to compete, there is a posted order of go for each class. Winners are awarded double points toward CVSJA year-end awards. There is only one class in each division which will consist of 12 jumps, and will be scored under the USEF Table II, Section 2 format. Riders may choose to do their jump-off immediately following their qualifying round or come back at the end of all the qualifying rounds. Each class must have 5 riders to fill the class. Presentation of sashes and a celebration victory gallop will follow each division.
