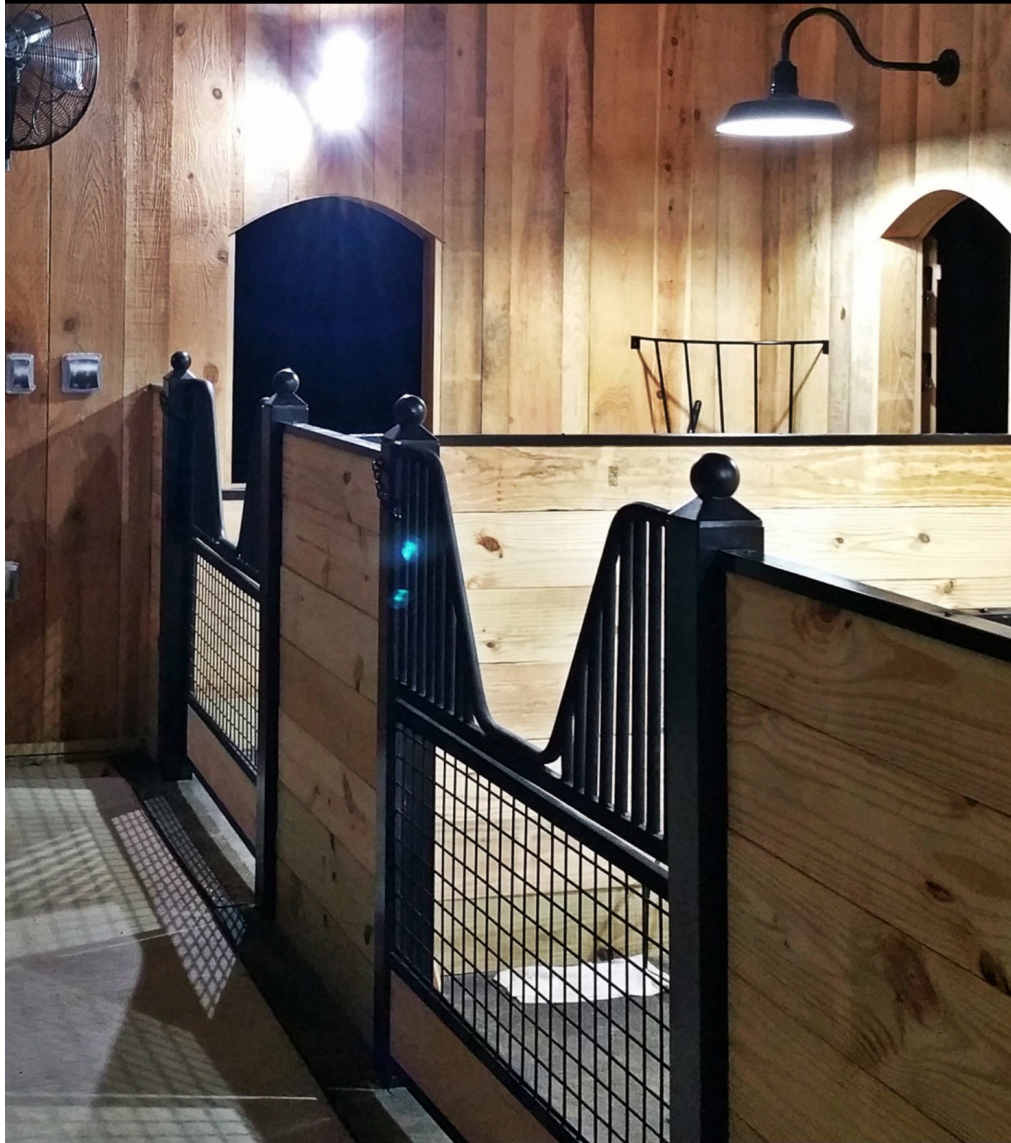

ENTRIES:

All exhibitors must provide the show office with a current negative
coggins report for each horse brought on the show grounds.

Entry form must be filled out completely, including all signatures, and
must be accompanied by an open check before back numbers may be
picked up. Online Entries are required via www.horshowsonline.com.
Please pre-enter by 5 PM THURSDAY prior to the horse show.

SCHOOLING:

Schooling will be permitted after 12:00 noon and until 6:00 PM the day
before the show. Flatwork Only will also be available prior to the start of
the show on the day of competition as determined by the course
designer.

COGGINS: All exhibitors must provide the show office with a current
negative coggins report for each horse brought onto the show grounds,
regardless if they are showing. If the horse is showing, the coggins must
be shown prior to picking up back number.

STABLING:

Limited stabling is available. Stalls will be pre-bedded. Stall orders must
be pre-paid by noon the Monday prior to the show. Stalls may be paid
for by open check or Credit Card information. Please call or text your
stall order in to **Tara Deckel (508-776-9247) by 12 PM, noon by
the Monday prior to the show. Stall Fees must be paid for at
time of reservation by open check or credit card.**

Please note stall fees are per DAY not per night.

AWARDS:

Six ribbons will be awarded in each class. Champion and Reserve
Champion ribbons will be awarded in each division.

CLASSES AND DIVISIONS

ADULT EQUITATION ON THE FLAT - Open to amateurs 18 years of age and older. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the flat. Riders must stay within their age group if classes are split by age.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 14 & Under - Open to riders who have not reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 15-17 and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 15-17 - Open to riders who have reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year, but not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 14 & under and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

VHSA CHILDREN'S PONY MEDAL CLASS: Open to junior members of the VHSA who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. Testing must be included in the course. Open to ponies only. Small and medium ponies to jump 2'0". Large ponies to jump 2'6". Riders may not compete in any class where the fence height exceeds 2'6" at the same show. There will be no additional test for this class. The VHSA Children's Pony Medal may run concurrently with the small, medium and large children's pony division, and may be combined with the MHSA Children's Pony Medal Class. There must be at least (3) exhibitors to fill the class. Six ribbons. In the Finals, the judge must test at least the top 4 over fences. The top 20 point earners qualify for the finals to be held at The Warrenton Pony Show.

VHSA CHILDREN'S MEDAL CLASS: Open to Junior members of VHSA who have not reached their 18th birthday. Riders may not compete in any class where the fence height exceeds 3 feet, 3 inches (1.0m) with the exception of the Childrens/Adult Jumper division, at the same show, where a rider may not jump higher than 3'9" (1.15m). Rider must be a member of VHSA prior to entry in the class according to Article II, 3. Open to horses only. To be shown over a course of not less than six (6) obstacles at three (3) feet, which must include one combination and two changes of direction. All VHSA Medal Class courses must have at least two of the following inside the course: a roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, or a long ride to a single jump. This also applies to the show hosting the VHSA Adult/Children's Hunter Medal Finals. The judge must call back at least four exhibitors for further testing over fences. Fall of horse or rider or three disobediences shall eliminate a contender. There must be at least three (3) exhibitors to fill the class and three (3) exhibitors must complete the course in order for that particular class to count. Six Ribbons. This Medal can be combined with the VHSA Adult Medal. In the Finals, same testing applies.

VHSA ADULT AMATEUR MEDAL CLASS: Open to horses only. Rider must be a member of VHSA prior to entry in the class according to Article II, 3. and must hold a current amateur card issued by USEF. To be shown over a course of not less than six (6) obstacles at three (3) feet, which must include one combination and two changes of direction. All VHSA Medal Class courses must have at least two of the following inside the course: a roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, or a long ride to a single jump. Riders may not compete in any class where the fence height exceeds 3 feet, 3 inches (1.0m) with the exception of the Childrens/Adult Jumper division, at the same show, where a rider may not jump higher than 3'9" (1.15m). This also applies to the show hosting the VHSA Adult/Children's Hunter Medal Finals. The judge must call back at least four exhibitors for further testing over fences. Jumping faults of mount not to count. Fall of horse or rider or three disobediences shall eliminate a contender. There must be at least three (3) exhibitors to fill the class and three (3) exhibitors must complete the course in order for that particular class to count. Six Ribbons. This Class can be combined with the VHSA Children's Medal. In the Finals, same testing applies.

CLASSES AND DIVISIONS

0.75 JUMPER – (SWVHJA) Fences 0.70-0.75 meters. USEF Tables I-IV may be used.

LOW JUMPER (SWVHJA & VHSA) – This division shall be no lower than 0.75m in height and no greater than 0.90m in height. Spreads shall be no greater than the height of the fence. All classes should be offered under Table IV. If holding a VHSA Association show, the VHSA division names must be used on the results.

TRAINING JUMPER – Fences over .90 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

CHILDREN'S / ADULT JUMPER (SWVHJA & VHSA) – Open to horses or ponies ridden by a junior or adult amateur exhibitor. Fences .95 to 1.05 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

SCHOOLING JUMPER?LEVEL 2 JUMPER (SWVHJA & VHSA) – Fences .95 – 1.0 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

LEVEL 3 JUMPER (SWVHJA) – Fences over 1.0 – 1.10 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

MODIFIED?LEVEL 4 JUMPER (SWVHJA & VHSA) – Fences over 1.10 – 1.20 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

LEVEL 5 JUMPER (SWVHJA) – Fences over 1.20 meters. USEF Tables I – IV may be used.

VHSA ASSOCIATE THOROUGHBRED JUMPER (VHSA)- The VHSA Associate Thoroughbred Jumper Division is limited to horses who are registered with or are eligible to be registered with the Jockey Club. In order to accrue VHSA Associate points the height for this division the jump/fence heights in each class shall be no lower than 2'6" and no higher than 3'0". Spreads shall be no greater than height of the fence. The VHSA Associate Thoroughbred Jumper Division may not be combined with any other VHSA Associate recognized division with the exception of the Low Jumpers when necessary. Horses must be registered with the VHSA and owners must be current VHSA members in order to accrue points towards VHSA Associate year-end awards.

VHSA PONY EQUITATION MEDAL CLASS: Open to Junior Members of the VHSA who have not reached their 18th birthday. Rider must be a member of VHSA prior to entry in the class. To be ridden on ponies over a course of not less than 6 obstacles; 2'3" for ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands, 2'6" for ponies over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 13.2 hands, and ponies over 13.2 hands not exceeding 14.2 hands jump 2'9"-3'. Jumping fault of mount not to count. Fall of pony or rider or three disobediences shall eliminate a contender. Entrants in this class may not compete in the VHSA Hunter Seat Medal Class at the same show. There must be at least three (3) exhibitors to fill the class and three (3) exhibitors must complete the course in order for that particular class to count. Six Ribbons. The VHSA Pony Medal may run concurrently with the small, medium and large pony division, and may be combined with the MHSA Pony Medal Class. Test must be included in the original course. At the Finals, the judge must test at least the top 4 over fences.

CLASSES AND DIVISIONS

LOW EQUITATIONL – Open to Juniors and Amateurs on horses or ponies. Fences to be 18' and 2'. No Oxers. To be judged on rider's position and control.

PRE-BEGINNER EQUITATION-Open to Junior and Amateur Riders in their first year of showing over fences less than 2' in height. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence height 2' or above. This division will not count against the rider's one year eligibility for the Beginner Equitation division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Division may be combined with Beginner Equitation division at managements discretion if entries warrant. Fence height 18". No oxers permitted.

BEGINNER EQUITATION – Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences 2' in height. No oxers permitted. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights exceeding 2'. This division will not count against rider's 2 year eligibility for the Intermediate Hunter division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Division may be split between juniors and adults at the discretion of show management.

PONY EQUITATION- Open to Juniors mounted on ponies. Small ponies (not to exceed 12.2h) to jump 2', medium ponies (over 12.2h - not to exceed 13.2h) to jump 2'3", large ponies (over 13.2h - not to exceed 14.2h) to jump 2'6". To be judged on rider's position and control.

INTERMEDIATEEequitation - Open to Juniors or Amateurs in their first or second year of showing, on horses or ponies, excluding the Pre-Beginner and Beginner Equitation division. Fences 2'3". Once a rider shows over fences 2'6" or higher they are no longer eligible for the Intermediate Equitation division in subsequent years. To be judged on rider's position and control. The rider may not jump higher than 2'6" at the same horse show.

PRE-CHILD/ADULT EQUITATION - Open to Junior and Amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Fences to be 2'6" or 2'9". Both heights will be offered and judged together. Judged on riders position and control. Horse/rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2'9" at the same horse show. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the pony equitation division at the same horse show.

CHILD/ADULT EQUITATION - Open to Junior and Amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Fences to be 3'. Judged on riders position and control. Horse/rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 3'6" at the same horse show. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the pony equitation division at the same horse show.

OPEN EQUITATION- Open to Junior and Amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Fences to be 3'3". Judged on riders position and control. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the pony equitation division at the same horse show.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION- (SWVHJA & VHSA) Open to riders 12 years of age and under. To be judged on rider's position and control. Riders may not cross enter into the SWVHJA Beginner Equitation or any division with fences over 2'. The division consists of one walk/trot class, one walk/trot/canter class, and one over fences class with fences not to exceed 18".

ADULT HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE - (SWVHJA & VHSA) Open to horses shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by an Adult. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) It is acceptable for SWVHJA Horse Shows to combine the Adult Hunter Pleasure and the Junior Pleasure Hunter Divisions, however, it is the show secretary's responsibility to indicate on the results which is the Adult rider and which is the Junior rider. If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Division and the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. To be judged on manners, suitability, and way of going. For year end points to accrue, three entries must enter and compete in all three classes of the division.

JUNIOR HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE -(SWVHJA & VHSA) Same specs as the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse except open to Junior riders.

HUNTER PLEASURE PONY - (SWVHJA & VHSA)Open to ponies shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by a Junior. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse division. A pony can be considered a horse at a show if the pony is not exhibited in a pony restricted division such as pony. Therefore, it is acceptable for an adult to ride a pony in the Adult Pleasure Division as long as the pony is not shown in pony restricted division at the same show.

CLASSES AND DIVISIONS

SWVHJA ADULT MEDAL - Same specs as for the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class, except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Hunter Seat Medal. SWVHJA Adult Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners, with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Adult Medal Finals.

SWVHJA HUNTER SEAT MEDAL - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3' that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. Same horse must be used for both phases. To qualify for the finals, a rider must accumulate 20 points during the show year. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners, with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Hunter Seat Medal Finals.

SWVHJA PONY MEDAL - Open to current junior members of SWVHJA mounted on ponies. To be shown over a minimum of 6 jumps at the appropriate heights. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. The same pony must be used for both phases. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If no Pony Medal is offered, a rider may compete on a pony in the Hunter Seat Medal. A rider cannot compete in both the Pony and the Hunter Seat Medals in one show, nor can they participate in both aforementioned finals in one year. SWVHJA Pony Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners, with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Pony Medal Finals.

HOLLINS MEDAL— Open to junior and adult amateur riders who have not qualified for the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal, SWVHJA Adult Medal, or the Oakridge Medal during the existing or previous year; qualifiers for the SWVHJA Pony medal are still eligible. The class will consist of 2 phases, each counting for 50% of the total score. First phase shall be shown over a course of fences and will not contain a combination. The second phase will be a flat phase, shown at the walk, trot, and canter both directions of the ring. The same horse must be used for both phases. Martingales are permitted in the flat phase.

SWEET BRIAR COLLEGE MEDAL— Open to juniors and amateurs. To be shown over a course of no less than 6 jumps at 2'9". Course must include 2 changes of direction, and may contain an in and out. The judge will then have the option of testing the top 4 riders. Tests 1-10 may be used. The same horse must be used in both phases. Three competitors must complete the course for points to count. Riders may not have shows in a 3'6" or higher Equitation medal class, and may not jump higher than 2'9" at the same show. This class may be combined with other classes of similar specifications. This class is not recognized or sanctioned by SWVHJA. Finals will be held at the Sweet Briar College Winter Horse Show in December. To qualify for the finals, a rider must accumulate 20 points, or be in the top 15 point earners for the year. Riders may continue to compete throughout the year.

OAKRIDGE MEDAL- Open to juniors and amateurs. To be judged on style and execution. Flat phase to run first to count as 50%. Jump order will be determined by the judge. Over fences phase to consist of a USET- type equitation, A/O-Junior Jumper course of at least 10 fences 3'3" in height with spreads up to 4'. The course must include one triple combination or 2 double combinations. Additional spread fences are required elsewhere on the course. A time allowed may be used for the first round based upon a speed of at least 345 yards per minute.

HUNTER PLEASURE PONY - Open to ponies shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by a Junior. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse division and Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. A pony can be considered a horse at a show if the pony is not exhibited in a pony restricted division such as pony. Therefore, it is acceptable for an adult to ride a pony in the Adult Pleasure Division as long as the pony is not shown in pony restricted division at the same show.
